(5) ANY PERSON WHO DISCLOSES CONFIDENTIAL RECORDS OR INFORMATION IN VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE COMMITS A CLASS 1 MISDEMEANOR AND SHALL BE PUNISHED AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 18-1.3-501, C.R.S. ANY CRIMINAL PROSECUTION PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION MUST BE BROUGHT WITHIN FIVE YEARS FROM THE DATE THE VIOLATION OCCURRED.".

Renumber succeeding section accordingly.

Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 2, strike "30-11-105" and substitute "1-45-117 (4)".

Page 2, strike lines 4 through 18 and substitute:

- "1-45-117. State and political subdivisions limitations on contributions. (4) (a) Any violation of this section shall be subject to the provisions of sections 9 (2) and 10 (1) of article XXVIII of the state constitution or any appropriate order or relief, including an order directing the person making a contribution or expenditure in violation of this section to reimburse the fund of the state or political subdivision, as applicable, from which such moneys were diverted for the amount of the contribution or expenditure, injunctive relief, or a restraining order to enjoin the continuance of the violation.
- (b) If a board of county commissioners is found to have made a contribution or expenditure in violation of this section, an individual member of the board who voted in favor of or otherwise authorized the contribution or expenditure may be ordered to reimburse an amount pursuant to paragraph (a) of this subsection (4) as long at the amount does not exceed the amount ordered to be reimbursed by any other individual of the board who voted in favor or otherwise authorized the contribution or expenditure."
