"(B) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE MONEYS TO THE STATE DEPARTMENT IN A SEPARATE LINE ITEM TO REIMBURSE THE COUNTIES FOR FIFTY PERCENT OF CHILD SUPPORT COLLECTIONS AND THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR ITS SHARE OF CHILD SUPPORT COLLECTIONS THAT ARE PASSED THROUGH TO TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF) RECIPIENTS PURSUANT TO THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II). THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL ALLOCATE AND DISTRIBUTE THE MONEYS TO THE COUNTIES.
