

UPDATED SUMMARY
SENATE BILL 16-080

Second Regular Session - Seventieth Colorado General Assembly

This summary applies to the reengrossed version of this bill as introduced in the second house. It does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. This summary reflects only the main points of the legislation.

Under current law, if a person is growing adult-use marijuana in a residence and a person under 21 years of age lives at the residence, the grow site must be in an enclosed and locked space. If no one under 21 years of age lives in the residence but a person under 21 years of age enters the residence, the person growing the marijuana must ensure access to the grow site is reasonably restricted while the person under 21 years of age is staying at the residence. The bill applies the same conditions to a person growing medical marijuana. *The bill allows the grow site to be outside of an enclosed and locked space and does not require reasonable restrictions if the person is under 21 years of age but at least 18 years of age and has a valid medical marijuana registry card or is a primary caregiver.*
