BILL TOPIC: COUNTY AUTHORITY TO DESIGNATE PIONEER TRAIL

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows a board of county commissioners to designate, by resolution, any public roads in the county as a section of a pioneer trail. A pioneer trail consists of public roads that follow original routes of travel of national historic significance. To make such a designation, the board must identify all of the roads that make up the pioneer trail. If any of the roads belong to the state highway system, the board must send a copy of the resolution to the Colorado Department of Transportation. The county may post, or allow to be posted, identifying and informative signs related to the pioneer trail along county roads.

Local Government Impact

County governments that designate public roads in the county as a section of a pioneer trail and post signs will incur costs to identify routes and post signs.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 10, 2016, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 11, 2016, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
