Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$24,072 cash funds from the Workers' Compensation Cash Fund to the Department of Labor and Employment for FY 2016-17. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE to implement the act.

Future Fiscal Impact

Passage of this bill will likely increase costs of workers' compensations claims to the Department of Personnel, however, these costs will be accounted for through the yearly actuarial process that assist in setting budgets for items like workers' compensation.
