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**BILL TOPIC:** DA REPRESENTATION INTERSTATE OFFENDER COMPACTS

**Summary of Legislation**

This bill clarifies that a district attorney must appear on behalf of the state and counties of his or her district in any probable cause hearing for a matter under the Interstate Compact for Adult Offender Supervision or the Interstate Compact for Juveniles.

**Background**

Under the rules of these interstate compacts on the supervision of out-of-state offenders, an offender is entitled to a probable cause hearing before he or she is returned to the state in which the offender was sentenced.

**Assessment**

This bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact as it codifies current practice by district attorneys.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
