## **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill neither requires nor contains an appropriation clause for FY 2016-17.

#### **Points to Consider**

Pursuant to Section 24-34-104 (f), C.R.S., the Sex Offender Management Board (SOMB) is scheduled to sunset on September 1, 2016. Pursuant to Section 24-34-104 (5) (b), C.R.S., the SOMB will be given until September 1, 2017, to wind up its affairs if it is not renewed by this or another bill. The FY 2016-17 Long Bill contains appropriations that will allow the SOMB to continue operations during FY 2016-17. The first two months of the Long Bill appropriation fund operations until the sunset date, September 1, 2016; the remainder of the Long Bill appropriation funds operations from the sunset date until June 30, 2017. If this bill, H.B. 16-1345, becomes law, the funding in the Long Bill will support the SOMB during its first 10 months of operation following renewal. If this bill does not become law, the funding in the Long Bill will support the SOMB

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during the first 10 months of its wind-up year. The right most "continuation" column in the *Fiscal Impact Summary* table of the Revised Fiscal Note shows the cost of operating the SOMB from September 1, 2017, to June 30, 2018. If the SOMB is not renewed by this bill or another bill, the SOMB will cease operation on September 1, 2017 and FY 2017-18 state spending will decline by the amount shown in the continuation column.
