Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$24,985 cash funds from Emergency Medical Services Account within the Highway Users Tax Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2016-17. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE to implement the act. The amendment also appropriates \$3,800 to the Department of Law from reappropriated funds for the provision of legal services to the Department of Public Health and Environment.
