HOUSE BILL 16-1324

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A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF COMPOUNDED PHARMACEUTICAL DRUGS FOR USE BY A VETERINARIAN TO TREAT A PATIENT'S EMERGENCY CONDITION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, a veterinarian cannot maintain an office stock of compounded drugs, which are drugs that are combined, mixed, or otherwise altered to create a specific drug or formulation, for later distribution or administration to patients. The bill authorizes:

! A compounding pharmacy to compound and distribute a

drug to a veterinarian without a specific patient indicated to receive the compounded drug; and

A veterinarian to dispense a compounded drug, maintained as part of the veterinarian's office stock, in an amount not to exceed 5 days' worth of doses, if a patient has an emergency condition that the compounded drug is necessary to treat and the veterinarian cannot access, in a timely manner, the compounded drug through a compounding pharmacy.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-118, amend

3 (3) (b) and (6) (b) as follows:

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12-42.5-118. Compounding - dispensing - sale of drugs and devices - rules - definition. (3) (b) (I) EXCEPT AS PERMITTED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b), a wholesaler may sell or deliver to a person responsible for the control of an animal a drug intended for veterinary use for that animal only if a licensed veterinarian has issued, prior to such BEFORE sale or delivery, a written prescription drug in the course of an order for the existing, valid veterinarian-client-patient relationship as defined in section 12-64-103 (15.5); except that, if the prescription order is for a drug that is not a controlled substance or is a controlled substance listed on schedule III, IV, or V, the licensed veterinarian may issue an oral prescription order for that drug. If the licensed veterinarian issues an oral prescription order for a controlled substance listed on schedule III, IV, or V, the licensed veterinarian shall provide a written prescription to the wholesaler within three business days after issuing the oral order.

(II) (A) WHETHER A COMPOUNDED DRUG IS A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE OR A NONCONTROLLED SUBSTANCE, A WHOLESALER MAY SELL

18	paragraph (b) to no more than ten percent of the total number of drug
19	dosage units dispensed and distributed on an annual basis by the outlet.

15	SECTION 12-42.5-118.5, THE VETERINARIAN MAY MAINTAIN AN OFFICE
16	STOCK OF COMPOUNDED DRUGS.
17	(3) (a) As used in this subsection (3), unless the context otherwise
18	requires:
19	(IV.5) "Office stock" has the same meaning as set forth in
20	SECTION 12-42.5-118.5 (3) (b).
21	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-64-111, add (1)
22	(a.5) as follows:
23	12-64-111. Discipline of licensees. (1) Upon receipt of a signed
24	complaint by a complainant or upon its own motion, the board may
25	proceed to a hearing in conformity with section 12-64-112. After a
26	hearing, and by a concurrence of a majority of members, the board may
27	deny a license to an applicant or revoke or suspend the license of, place

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1	on probation, or otherwise discipline or fine, a licensed veterinarian for
2	any of the following reasons:
3	(a.5) VIOLATION OF SECTION 12-42.5-118.5 OR ANY RULES OF THE
4	PHARMACY BOARD PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO THAT SECTION;
5	SECTION 5. Effective date. This act takes effect January 1,
6	2017.
7	SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
8	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
