The House Finance Committee Report (04/20/16) amends the bill to require that nonresident pharmacies be inspected by third-party inspectors instead of by the Department of Regulatory Agencies. As amended by the Finance Committee, the bill requires and expenditure of \$10,701 cash funds for FY 2016-17. The following table summarizes the updated fiscal impact of the bill.

Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$10,701 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2016-17. This provision also provides \$9,501 reappropriated funds the Department of Law for the provision of legal services.
