Bill Summary

The bill designates the fourth Monday in March as "Public Lands Day" to recognize the significant contributions that national public lands within Colorado make to wildlife, recreation, the economy, and to

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1. Legislative declaration.** (1) The general assembly 3 hereby finds and declares that: 4 (a) Colorado contains a variety of <u>national</u>, <u>state</u>, <u>and local</u> public 5 lands, including national parks, national forests, wildlife refuges, 6 monuments, wilderness areas, and other public lands; 7 (b) Colorado's public lands reflect many of our most noble 8 democratic ideals, because they are open and accessible to everyone, no 9 matter how rich or poor; 10 (c) Colorado's public lands are defining features of the state and 11 are a foundation for our quality of life by supporting the vitality of our 12 communities, as well as representing Colorado's common heritage, fossils 13 marking where dinosaurs roamed, ancient ruins and petroglyphs dotting 14 the canyons, and historic mining towns nestled in steep-sided valleys; 15 (d) Colorado's public lands feature an amazingly diverse range of 16 landscapes, from the snow-capped peaks of the Rocky Mountains down 17 to rushing rivers, red rock canyons to grassy plains, grasslands, and 18 tree-lined mountain valleys; 19 (e) Colorado's public lands provide many benefits to our residents 20 and support a wide variety of activities, from recreational pursuits, such as hunting, fishing, hiking, biking, cross-country skiing, and rafting, to 21 22 natural resource development; 23 (f) Colorado's public lands have a substantial impact on economic 24 development and jobs through mineral extraction, timber sales, ranching, 25 tourism, and the outdoor recreation industry;

1	(g) Colorado's public lands contribute to Colorado's clean air and
2	clean water;
3	(h) Coloradans will benefit when the three levels of government
4	in the federal, state, and local government systems are working in greater
5	harmony and in partnership, which acknowledges the unique capacity of
6	local law enforcement to positively influence matters of public safety, \underline{to}
7	serve diverse public needs for access and utilization of public lands;
8	(i) Coloradans of all races, ethnicities, occupations, and lifestyles
9	continue to derive multiple benefits from the traditional, long-standing
10	multiple-use management philosophy of public lands under the
11	stewardship of the National Forest Service and the United States Bureau
12	of Land Management, practices that reflect the public support for policies
13	incorporating a judicious balance between aesthetic, ecological,
14	recreational, and economic values;
15	(j) Coloradans have demonstrated for over a century the ability to
16	balance the values of preservation, conservation, and economic
17	productivity, clearly indicating that these values are not in conflict; and
18	(k) Early and consistent cooperative and collaborative
19	involvement of local governments in federal land management
20	decision-making processes can improve federal land management
21	outcomes, reduce conflict, and save state, local, and federal resources;
22	and
23	(l) Local citizens and state agencies should be consulted and relied
24	upon to lead efforts to protect endangered species.
25	(2) The general assembly further finds and declares that:
26	(a) It is imperative to encourage effective cooperative and
27	collaborative engagement among counties, municipalities, the state, and

2	(b) It is appropriate for the state to publicly observe and pay
3	tribute to the importance of Colorado's public lands by observing Public
4	Lands Day on the third Saturday in May in each year.
5	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-11-113 as
6	follows:
7	24-11-113. Public lands day. (1) The <u>Third Saturday in May</u>
8	IN EACH YEAR IS KNOWN AS "PUBLIC LANDS DAY", AND APPROPRIATE
9	OBSERVANCE MAY BE HELD BY THE PUBLIC AND IN ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS
10	OF THE STATE IN TRIBUTE TO THE IMPORTANCE OF PUBLIC LANDS IN THE
11	STATE.
12	
13	(2) ANNUALLY THE GOVERNOR SHALL ISSUE A PROCLAMATION
14	CALLING FOR THE CELEBRATION OF PUBLIC LANDS DAY.
15	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
16	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
17	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
18	10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
19	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
20	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
21	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
22	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
23	November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
24	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
