A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLEMENTAL
102	ONLINE EDUCATION RESOURCES, AND, IN CONNECTION
103	THEREWITH, CREATING THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
104	AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://www.leg.state.co.us/billsummaries</u>.)

Under current law, a board of cooperative services (BOCES) is designated to make supplemental online education courses, teacher professional development, and consulting services available to school districts, charter schools, and other BOCES (local education providers). The designated BOCES contracts with nonprofit entities to provide these services.

The bill creates the statewide supplemental online and blended learning program (program) to better administer the availability of these courses and services. The designated BOCES is charged with leading and administering the program, which includes creating a statewide plan for making supplemental online and blended learning resources available to local education providers. In administering the program, the designated BOCES may contract with multiple nonprofit providers for the supplemental online education courses, professional development, and consulting services. The designated BOCES must also actively market the program to local education providers. The designated BOCES may expend up to 10 % of the amount appropriated for the program to offset the increased costs of administering the program.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

- 6 (1) The short title of this section is the "Empowering Digital
- 7 LEARNING FOR ALL ACT".

(1) (2) (a) (I) The general assembly finds that:

9 (A) Online education courses that are supplemental to the 10 education program provided by a school district, charter school, or 11 BOCES are a valuable resource for schools because they allow a school 12 district, charter school, or BOCES to provide a much richer, more varied 13 curriculum of courses for students at all levels of achievement. Many 14 small school districts and rural communities, however, lack the capacity 15 and resources to develop their own supplemental online courses and blended learning strategies THE OVERWHELMING INFLUENCE OF THE 16 17 RAPIDLY EVOLVING USE OF TECHNOLOGY AND THE INTERNET WILL RENDER.

HIGH-QUALITY REMOTE DIGITAL EDUCATIONAL CONTENT ALMOST
 COST-FREE AFTER A PERIOD OF DECLINING COSTS. ACCESS TO DIGITAL
 CONTENT AND EDUCATIONAL COURSES IS ALREADY AN ESSENTIAL PART OF
 THE HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM, BUT IS NOT WIDELY APPLIED IN
 ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY EDUCATION. WHILE SOME SCHOOL
 DISTRICTS HAVE BEEN ABLE TO KEEP PACE WITH THE CHANGING CONTEXT
 OF PUBLIC EDUCATION, MOST HAVE NOT.

8 (B) Supplemental online education courses provide tools for 9 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES to use in decreasing the 10 college remediation rates and in helping their students comply with the 11 higher education admission guidelines; THE SCOPE OF THE COMING 12 CHANGE IN THE DELIVERY OF PUBLIC EDUCATION SERVICES IS MASSIVE 13 AND MORE FAR-REACHING THAN THE CURRENTLY AVAILABLE CONSTRUCTS 14 OF ONLINE LEARNING OR BLENDED LEARNING. THE SCOPE OF THE CHANGE 15 IS SUCH THAT EVERY PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE STATE MUST EVOLVE INTO A 16 DIGITAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT THAT CAPITALIZES ON THE 17 STUDENT-TEACHER RELATIONSHIP WHILE LEVERAGING THE ADVANCES 18 THAT THE TECHNOLOGY REVOLUTION BRINGS.

19 The cost of supplemental online education courses is (C) 20 prohibitive for many school districts, charter schools, and BOCES whose 21 students may be most in need of these courses. Because of the value of 22 these courses, it is appropriate that the state provide moneys to assist 23 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES in purchasing supplemental 24 online education courses THE PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEM MUST TAKE 25 ADVANTAGE OF THIS OPPORTUNITY TO SIGNIFICANTLY IMPROVE 26 STATEWIDE EDUCATIONAL EQUITY BY DELIVERING EDUCATIONAL 27 SERVICES THROUGH THE DIGITAL LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. IT IS LIKELY

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THAT FAILURE TO EMBRACE THIS CHANGE IN THE DELIVERY OF PUBLIC
 EDUCATION SERVICES WILL LEAD TO A DECLINE IN THE EQUITY AND
 QUALITY OF THE SYSTEM OF PUBLIC EDUCATION IN COLORADO.

4 (D) COLORADO LACKS A CLEARLY ARTICULATED AND ACCEPTED 5 VISION AND PLAN TO IMPLEMENT THE SHIFT IN DELIVERING EDUCATIONAL 6 SERVICES TO A DIGITAL ENVIRONMENT, WHICH MUST OCCUR TO 7 ADEQUATELY PREPARE STUDENTS FOR POSTSECONDARY SUCCESS. IT IS 8 CRUCIAL THAT THE STATE IDENTIFY A SINGLE PUBLIC ENTITY TO PROVIDE 9 LEADERSHIP IN DESIGNING AND IMPLEMENTING A STATEWIDE PLAN FOR 10 INCREASING THE AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATIONAL 11 COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER 12 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES.

13 (II) It is therefore in the best interests of the state to invest 14 INCREASE ITS INVESTMENT in the expansion of affordable, high-quality 15 supplemental online education courses and blended learning support for 16 school districts, charter schools, and BOCES, especially those that lack 17 the capacity to develop their own supplemental ONLINE EDUCATION 18 COURSE offerings, by subsidizing the provision of SUPPLEMENTAL online 19 education courses, professional development, and technical assistance to 20 implement SUPPLEMENTAL online and blended learning statewide.

(III) Due to its experience in assisting school districts with
 SUPPLEMENTAL online EDUCATION COURSES and blended learning in
 Colorado, it is further in the best interests of the state to designate a
 BOCES to contract through a request for a proposal process that adheres
 to the goals set forth in paragraph (a.5) of this subsection (1) developed
 in consultation with the department, with one or more nonprofit providers
 to provide resources for school districts, charter schools, and BOCES in

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1	the form of supplemental online course offerings, professional
2	development for educators, and consulting assistance for schools and
3	school districts wanting to use online and blended learning for their
4	students. In contracting with providers, the priority shall result in the
5	expansion of student access to quality supplemental online courses and
6	resources available to implement supplemental online and blended
7	learning in school districts, charter schools, and BOCES statewide
8	ARTICULATE THE STATEWIDE PLAN FOR SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
9	BLENDED LEARNING AND TO LEAD, MANAGE, AND ADMINISTER THE
10	STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM IN
11	ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION.
12	(a.5) The general assembly also finds that the goals of online
13	courses and blended learning strategies are to:
14	(I) Expand the availability of online courses and blended learning
15	strategies;
16	(II) Increase the number of students taking high-quality, effective,
17	and affordable online courses;
18	(III) Establish a program to work with school districts, charter
19	schools, and BOCES to create, offer, and sustain their own high-quality,
20	effective, and affordable blended learning courses, as well as targeted
21	professional development and mentoring support;
22	(IV) Increase the capacity of educators in school districts, charter
23	schools, and BOCES to utilize standards, data, and interventions in
24	regular, online, and blended learning classes; and
25	(V) Document and share best practices in online and blended
26	learning.
27	(b) It is further the intent of The general assembly DECLARES that

the amount necessary to reduce the cost to school districts, charter schools, and BOCES of purchasing supplemental online education courses IMPLEMENT THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM MAY be appropriated annually from federal mineral leasing revenues transferred to the state public school fund pursuant to section 34-63-102, C.R.S., and section 22-54-114 (1).

7 (c) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER DECLARES THAT, FOR 8 PURPOSES OF SECTION 17 OF ARTICLE IX OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION, THE 9 STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM IS 10 AN IMPORTANT ELEMENT IN IMPLEMENTING ACCOUNTABLE EDUCATION 11 REFORM AND ENABLING SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND 12 BOCES TO MEET STATE ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND MAY THEREFORE 13 RECEIVE FUNDING FROM THE STATE EDUCATION FUND CREATED IN SECTION 14 17 (4) OF ARTICLE IX OF THE STATE CONSTITUTION.

15 (2) (3) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise

17 (a) "ADMINISTERING BOCES" MEANS THE BOCES THAT THE

THROUGH WHICH A STUDENT LEARNS AT LEAST IN PART THROUGH DIGITAL
CONTENT WITH SOME ELEMENT OF STUDENT CONTROL AND AT LEAST IN
PART AT A SUPERVISED PHYSICAL LOCATION THAT IS NOT THE STUDENT'S
HOME.

25 (a) (c) "BOCES" means a board of cooperative services created
 26 pursuant to this article.

27 (b) (d) "Charter school" means a district charter school authorized

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1 pursuant to part 1 of article 30.5 of this title or an institute charter school 2 authorized pursuant to part 5 of article 30.5 of this title. 3 (c) (e) "Department" means the department of education created

4 and existing pursuant to section 24-1-115, C.R.S.

"LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION AGENCY" MEANS A SCHOOL (f) 6 DISTRICT, BOCES, OR CHARTER SCHOOL.

7 (d) (g) "Provider" means an A NONPROFIT entity OR A LOCAL 8 PUBLIC EDUCATION AGENCY that sells PROVIDES:

9 (I) Supplemental online education courses that are taught by 10 employees of the provider who are teachers licensed in Colorado pursuant 11 to article 60.5 of this title;

12 (II) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS; OR 13 (III) CONSULTING SERVICES FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER 14 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES WITH REGARD TO PROVIDING SUPPLEMENTAL 15 ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING.

(h) "SMALL RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT" MEANS A SCHOOL DISTRICT 16 17 IN COLORADO THAT THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES IS RURAL, BASED ON 18 THE GEOGRAPHIC SIZE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THE DISTANCE OF THE 19 SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM THE NEAREST LARGE, URBANIZED AREA, AND THAT 20 ENROLLS FEWER THAN ONE THOUSAND STUDENTS IN KINDERGARTEN 21 THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE.

22 (i) "STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING 23 PROGRAM" OR "PROGRAM" MEANS THE PROGRAM DESCRIBED IN 24 SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.

25 (e) (i) "Supplemental online education course" means an 26 education course that is:

27 (I) Taught by a teacher who is licensed pursuant to article 60.5 of 1 this title;

2 (II) Delivered via an internet A TECHNOLOGICALLY ENHANCED
3 format to one or more students at a location that is remote from the
4 delivery point; and

5 (III) Purchased DEVELOPED by a school district, charter school, or
6 BOCES OR OBTAINED from a provider to augment the education program
7 provided by the school district, charter school, or BOCES.

8 (4) (a) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATEWIDE 9 ASSOCIATION OF BOCES, SHALL DESIGNATE A BOCES TO LEAD, MANAGE, 10 AND ADMINISTER THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED 11 LEARNING PROGRAM AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION. IN ADMINISTERING 12 THE PROGRAM, THE BOCES, SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, 13 SHALL SELECT AND CONTRACT WITH PROVIDERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH 14 SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION TO PROVIDE THE RESOURCES DESCRIBED 15 IN PARAGRAPH (b) OF SUBSECTION (5) OF THIS SECTION. AT LEAST EVERY 16 FIVE YEARS, THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATEWIDE 17 ASSOCIATION OF BOCES, SHALL REVIEW THE DESIGNATION OF THE 18 ADMINISTERING BOCES AND MAY CONTINUE THE DESIGNATION OR 19 SELECT A DIFFERENT BOCES.

20 (b) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL MANAGE AND ADMINISTER
21 THE PROGRAM TO ACHIEVE, AT A MINIMUM, THE FOLLOWING GOALS:

22 (I) EXPANDING THE AVAILABILITY OF SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
23 EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING STRATEGIES;

24 (II) INCREASING SIGNIFICANTLY THE NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO
25 ENROLL IN HIGH-QUALITY, EFFECTIVE, AND AFFORDABLE SUPPLEMENTAL
26 ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES;

27 (III) WORKING WITH SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND

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BOCES TO CREATE, OFFER, AND SUSTAIN THEIR OWN HIGH-QUALITY,
 EFFECTIVE, AND AFFORDABLE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION
 COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING, AS WELL AS TARGETED PROFESSIONAL
 DEVELOPMENT AND MENTORING SUPPORT;

5 (IV) ASSISTING EDUCATORS IN LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION 6 AGENCIES TO INCREASE THEIR COMPETENCY SPECIFICALLY IN USING 7 DIGITAL LEARNING STRATEGIES TO LEAD AND INSTRUCT IN, AND 8 OTHERWISE IMPLEMENT, DIGITAL LEARNING; AND

9 (V) DOCUMENTING AND SHARING BEST PRACTICES IN PROVIDING
 10 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING.

11 (5) (a) IN LEADING THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND 12 BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM, THE ADMINISTERING BOCES, IN 13 PARTNERSHIP WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION, THE STATE BOARD 14 OF EDUCATION AND ONE OR MORE PRIVATE, NONPROFIT ENTITIES, SHALL 15 PREPARE A PLAN FOR INTEGRATING SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED 16 LEARNING INTO THE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS PROVIDED BY SCHOOL 17 DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, 18 CHARTER SCHOOL, AND BOCES MAY DETERMINE THE EXTENT TO WHICH 19 IT PARTICIPATES IN THE STATEWIDE PLAN.

20 (b) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ENSURE THAT, THROUGH
21 THE PROGRAM, ALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES
22 IN THE STATE HAVE ACCESS TO:

(I) SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING RESOURCES,
INCLUDING, AT A MINIMUM, SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION COURSES
AVAILABLE FROM CONTRACT PROVIDERS OR FROM A SCHOOL DISTRICT,
CHARTER SCHOOL, OR BOCES AND A LIBRARY OF DIGITAL COURSE
CONTENT;

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(II) PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT RESOURCES FOR TEACHERS,
 INCLUDING RESOURCES FOR CERTIFYING TEACHERS' ABILITY TO
 SUCCESSFULLY INTEGRATE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED
 LEARNING RESOURCES INTO SCHOOL-BUILDING-BASED EDUCATIONAL
 PROGRAMS; AND

6 (III) CONSULTING ASSISTANCE FOR SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER
7 SCHOOLS, AND BOCES THAT CHOOSE TO USE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
8 BLENDED LEARNING FOR STUDENTS, INCLUDING AN INVENTORY OF
9 SUCCESSFUL MODELS FOR INTEGRATING SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
10 EDUCATION COURSES AND BLENDED LEARNING INTO
11 SCHOOL-BUILDING-BASED EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS.

(c) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ACTIVELY MARKET TO
SCHOOL DISTRICTS, CHARTER SCHOOLS, AND BOCES THE AVAILABILITY
OF RESOURCES THROUGH THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND
BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM.

16 (d) THE ADMINISTERING BOCES MAY ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT
17 WITH THE STATEWIDE INTERNET PORTAL AUTHORITY CREATED IN ARTICLE
18 37.7 OF TITLE 24, C.R.S., TO PROVIDE THE PLATFORM FOR ACCESSING
19 SERVICES AND PROGRAMS AVAILABLE THROUGH THE STATEWIDE
20 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM.

(3) (6) (a) On or before February 15, 2015, and on or before
February 15 of every third year thereafter, the BOCES designated
pursuant to subsection (4) of this section shall, subject to available
appropriations, create THE ADMINISTERING BOCES SHALL ESTABLISH a
fair and transparent request for a proposal process to select one or more
nonprofit USE WHEN SELECTING providers to provide resources for school
districts, charter schools, and BOCES in the form of supplemental online

1 course offerings, professional development for educators, and consulting 2 assistance for school districts, charter schools, and BOCES wanting to 3 use online and blended learning for students. THE REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL PROCESS MUST 8 INCLUDE INPUT FROM A REVIEW COMMITTEE AS DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 9 (b) OF THIS SUBSECTION (6) THAT THE ADMINISTERING BOCES CONVENES 10 AS NEEDED. 11 (b) THE REVIEW COMMITTEE CONSISTS OF: 12 (I) A representative from the designated ADMINISTERING BOCES; 13 (II) A representative from the office in the department responsible for online and blended learning; 14 15 (III) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS SELECTED JOINTLY BY THE 16 ADMINISTERING BOCES AND THE DEPARTMENT: 17 (A) A national expert in online and blended learning; to be 18 selected by the designated BOCES and the department; 19 (B) An administrator from A SCHOOL THAT IS DESIGNATED an 20 alternative education campus school to be selected by the designated 21 BOCES and the department AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 22-7-604.5; and 22 (C) An administrator from a school that purchases OBTAINS online 23 or blended services to be selected by the designated BOCES and the 24 department. 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DESIGNEE, WHO HAS EXPERIENCE WITH SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE
 EDUCATION OR BLENDED LEARNING; AND

3 (B) ONE EDUCATOR SELECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT WHO IS 4 EMPLOYED IN A SMALL RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE DEPARTMENT IS 5 ENCOURAGED TO SELECT AN EDUCATOR WHO HAS EXPERIENCE WITH 6 SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE EDUCATION OR BLENDED LEARNING.

7 (c) The REVIEW committee shall review all proposals using an 8 established rubric RUBRICS and shall recommend one or more providers 9 for approval to the ADMINISTERING BOCES. designated pursuant to 10 subsection (4) of this section. If the designated ADMINISTERING BOCES 11 chooses not to follow the recommendations of the REVIEW committee 12 concerning any A provider, it shall provide the REVIEW committee with a 13 written explanation of its rationale for so doing THE RATIONALE FOR THE 14 DECISION.

(d) A PROVIDER THAT THE ADMINISTERING BOCES CONTRACTS
WITH PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (6) MAY SUBCONTRACT WITH ONE OR
MORE FOR-PROFIT OR NONPROFIT ENTITIES, LOCAL PUBLIC EDUCATION
AGENCIES, OR PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS IN MEETING THE OBLIGATIONS OF
ITS CONTRACT WITH THE ADMINISTERING BOCES.

20 (3.3) (7) Supplemental online education courses must be provided 21 to a purchasing school district, charter school, or BOCES at an affordable 22 total program cost for high-quality, accredited courses with local support. 23 (3.5) (8) Each high school student in Colorado may take at least 24 one supplemental online course per year. 14 (4) (9) The general assembly shall annually appropriate to the 15 department of education for allocation to a BOCES designated, in 16 consultation with the statewide association of BOCES, moneys THE 17 ADMINISTERING BOCES AN AMOUNT sufficient to administer THE 18 STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING PROGRAM 19 and fund any contract entered into with a provider THE CONTRACTS 20 ENTERED INTO WITH PROVIDERS pursuant to this section. The designated 21 ADMINISTERING BOCES may expend not more than two UP TO TEN 22 percent of the contract amount in administering any such contract THE 23 AMOUNT ANNUALLY APPROPRIATED TO OFFSET ITS COSTS INCURRED IN 24 LEADING, MANAGING, AND ADMINISTERING THE PROGRAM.

(5) (10) (a) On or before March 15, 2008 2017, and on or before
 March 15 each year thereafter, the designated ADMINISTERING BOCES
 shall submit to the education committees of the house of representatives

1 and the senate, or any successor committees, the joint budget committee 2 of the general assembly, THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION, and the 3 department a report summarizing the provision of supplemental online 4 courses pursuant to this section CONCERNING IMPLEMENTATION AND USE 5 OF THE STATEWIDE SUPPLEMENTAL ONLINE AND BLENDED LEARNING 6 PROGRAM FOR THE PRECEDING SCHOOL YEAR. At a minimum, the report 7 must include: 8 (a) The number of registrants in supplemental online courses, 9 disaggregated by the school district, charter school, or BOCES that 10 registered the students; 11 (b) The supplemental online course titles offered and the number 12 of registrants per course; 13 (c) Completion statistics for each supplemental online course, 14 disaggregated by semester;

15 (d) The number of supplemental online courses taken for both
 16 high school and postsecondary credit, disaggregated by postsecondary
 17 institution and school district;

18 (e) A list of the supplemental online courses developed or revised
19 by the contract provider;

20 (f) The strategies used successfully to facilitate student success in
 21 supplemental online course work;

22 (g) An analysis of the reasons school districts, charter schools, and
 23 BOCES use supplemental online courses;

24 (h) A description of any unique uses of supplemental online
 25 courses by school districts, charter schools, and BOCES;

26 (i) A description of any barriers encountered by school districts,

27 charter schools, or BOCES in using supplemental online courses;

1	(j) Results from an annual survey of parents, teachers, and
2	students regarding participation in and satisfaction with supplemental
3	online courses offered by a nonprofit provider with which the BOCES
4	designated pursuant to subsection (4) of this section contracted;
5	(k) Trend data related to the supplemental online learning
6	environment; and
7	(1) An accounting of the expenditure of the funds allocated
8	pursuant to subsection (4) of this section, which must include an
9	accounting by the designated BOCES and any contract providers.
10	(b) This subsection (10) is exempt from the provisions of
11	SECTION 24-1-136 (11), C.R.S., AND THE ANNUAL REPORTING
12	REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBSECTION (10) are effective until changed
13	BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTING BY BILL.
14	(6) Repealed.
15	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
16	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate

17 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
