J.001 Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$73,551 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2016-17. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.9 FTE. This provision provides \$2,850 reappropriated funds to the Department of Law for the provision of legal services.
