After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

<u>HB16-1227</u> be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on <u>Appropriations</u> with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 3, line 13, strike "SECTION." and substitute 1 2 "SECTION UNTIL THE TEEN PARENT HAS GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL 3 OR SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED A HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY 4 EXAMINATION. AFTER THE TEEN PARENT HAS BEEN DETERMINED ELIGIBLE 5 FOR CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE AND HIS OR HER CHOSEN CHILD CARE 6 PROVIDER IS RECEIVING SUBSIDY PAYMENTS, A COUNTY MAY REQUIRE THE 7 TEEN PARENT TO REGULARLY ATTEND, AT NO COST AND AT A LOCATION 8 AND TIME MOST CONVENIENT TO THE TEEN PARENT, INFORMATION 9 SESSIONS WITH THE COUNTY CHILD SUPPORT STAFF FOCUSED ON 10 UNDERSTANDING THE BENEFITS OF CHILD SUPPORT TO THE CHILD, THE 11 FAMILY AS A WHOLE, AND THE BENEFITS OF TWO-PARENT ENGAGEMENT IN 12 A CHILD'S LIFE.".

Page 3, strike lines 15 through 20 and substitute "PARENT OR HAS EITHER
GRADUATED FROM HIGH SCHOOL OR SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED A HIGH
SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY EXAMINATION, THE COUNTY MAY REQUIRE THAT
PERSON TO COOPERATE WITH CHILD SUPPORT ESTABLISHMENT AND
ENFORCEMENT AS A CONDITION OF CONTINUED RECEIPT OF CHILD CARE
ASSISTANCE. NOTHING IN THIS SECTION PREVENTS A TEEN PARENT FROM
ESTABLISHING CHILD SUPPORT.".

20 Page 5, after line 10 insert:

"(c) (I) ON JULY 1, 2017, AND EVERY JULY 1 THEREAFTER
THROUGH JULY 1, 2025, EACH COUNTY DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT TO

8 YOUNGER AND THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN BEING SERVED;

9 (B) THE TOTAL NUMBER OF TEEN PARENTS IN EACH COUNTY THAT 10 ARE RECEIVING COLORADO CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE;

(C) FOR EACH TEEN PARENT RECEIVING CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE
IN THE COUNTY, LONGITUDINAL DATA INDICATING WHETHER PATERNITY
HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED AND WHETHER CHILD SUPPORT HAS BEEN
ESTABLISHED FOR THE CHILD AND REPORTED FOR THE CHILD FROM BIRTH
TO AGE FOUR;

16 (D) FOR EACH TEEN PARENT RECEIVING CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE
17 IN THE COUNTY, LONGITUDINAL DATA INDICATING WHETHER THE TEEN
18 PARENT ACHIEVED ECONOMIC SELF-SUFFICIENCY AND AVOIDED BECOMING
19 A COLORADO WORKS PARTICIPANT WHILE IN SCHOOL AND REPORTED FOR
20 THE CHILD FROM THE CHILD'S BIRTH TO AGE FOUR;

(E) FOR EACH TEEN PARENT RECEIVING CHILD CARE ASSISTANCE
IN THE COUNTY, LONGITUDINAL DATA INDICATING THE TOTAL AMOUNT
AND THE PERCENTAGE OF CHILD SUPPORT COLLECTED FOR THE BENEFIT OF
THE CHILD AND REPORTED FOR THE CHILD FROM BIRTH TO AGE FOUR.

25 (II) THE REPORTS FILED WITH THE STATE DEPARTMENT AS A
26 RESULT OF THIS PARAGRAPH (c) ARE PUBLIC RECORDS AVAILABLE FOR
27 PUBLIC INSPECTION.

28 (d) UPON NOTIFICATION THAT THE RELEVANT HUMAN SERVICES 29 CASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS ARE CAPABLE OF ACCOMMODATING THE 30 PROVISIONS IN PARAGRAPHS (a.5) AND (a.7) OF THIS SUBSECTION (5), THE 31 STATE DEPARTMENT IS REQUIRED TO START TRACKING COUNTIES' 32 COMPLIANCE WITH PARAGRAPHS (a.5) AND (a.7) OF THIS SUBSECTION (5). 33 THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOTIFY COUNTIES WHEN THE HUMAN 34 SERVICES CASE MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS ARE FUNCTIONAL AND WHEN THE 35 TRACKING OF COMPLIANCE WILL BEGIN.".
