#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A REDUCTION IN THE AMOUNT OF THE GENERAL FUND 102 RESERVE REQUIRED FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2015-16.

## **Bill Summary**

**Joint Budget Committee.** For the fiscal year 2015-16, the bill reduces the statutorily required general fund reserve from 6.5% to 5.6% of the amount appropriated for expenditure from the general fund.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-201.1, amend
2	(1) (d) (XIV); and <b>add</b> (1) (d) (XVII) as follows:
3	24-75-201.1. Restriction on state appropriations - legislative
4	declaration - definitions. (1) (d) For each fiscal year, unrestricted
5	general fund year-end balances shall be retained as a reserve in the
6	following amounts:
7	(XIV) For the fiscal year 2014-15 and each fiscal year thereafter,
8	EXCLUDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2015-16, six and one-half percent of the
9	amount appropriated for expenditure from the general fund for that fiscal
10	year.
11	(XVII) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2015-16, FIVE AND SIX-TENTHS
12	PERCENT OF THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED FOR EXPENDITURE FROM THE
13	GENERAL FUND FOR THAT FISCAL YEAR.
14	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
15	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
