### A BILL FOR AN ACT

#### 101 **CONCERNING ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES.**

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under existing law, a school that meets specified criteria may be designated as an alternative education campus, which makes the school subject to accountability standards that are different from those that apply to other public schools. One of the criteria is that at least 95% of the school's student population has an individual education plan or meets the criteria for identification as an at-risk student under the alternative education campus statute or that at least 95% of the school's student population of these requirements. The bill reduces

the percentage to 90%. The bill also expands some of the criteria for being identified as an at-risk student for purposes of the alternative education campus statute.

The bill creates the school quality review pilot program to create a base for qualitative measurement of the performance of alternative education campuses. An alternative education campus that participates in the pilot program will receive annual on-site reviews of its operations. The pilot program starts in the 2016-17 school year and continues through the 2018-19 school year. The department of education must review the findings of the pilot program and recommend whether to expand the school quality reviews to additional alternative education campuses.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-604.5, amend 3 (1) (a) (VI) (B), (1.5) (b), (1.5) (f), (1.5) (g), and (1.5) (m) as follows: 4 22-7-604.5. Alternative education campuses - criteria -5 **application - rule-making.** (1) A public school may apply to the state 6 board for designation as an alternative education campus. The state board 7 shall adopt rules specifying the criteria and application process for a 8 public school to be designated an alternative education campus. The rules 9 must include but need not be limited to: 10 (a) Criteria that a public school must meet to be designated an 11 alternative education campus, including but not limited to the following: 12 (VI) (B) Serving a student population in which more than 13 ninety-five NINETY percent of the students have an individualized 14 education program pursuant to section 22-20-108 or meet the definition 15 of a high-risk student contained in subsection (1.5) of this section, or any 16 combination of these two criteria that equals at least ninety-five NINETY 17 percent of the student population; or (1.5) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires, 18

19 a "high-risk student" means a student enrolled in a public school who:

1 (b) Has dropped out of school or has not been continuously 2 enrolled and regularly attending school for at least one semester prior to 3 enrolling in his or her current public school; FOUR EXCUSED OR 4 UNEXCUSED ABSENCES FROM PUBLIC SCHOOL IN ANY ONE MONTH OR TEN 5 EXCUSED OR UNEXCUSED ABSENCES FROM PUBLIC SCHOOL DURING ANY 6 SCHOOL YEAR. ABSENCES DUE TO SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION OF A 7 STUDENT ARE CONSIDERED ABSENCES FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH 8 (b).

9 (f) Has a documented history of child abuse or neglect, HAS BEEN
10 ADJUDICATED A WARD OF THE COURT, OR HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN THE
11 FOSTER CARE SYSTEM;

12 (g) Has a parent or guardian in prison or on parole or probation OR
13 HAS EXPERIENCED THE LOSS OF A PARENT OR SIBLING;

(m) Has a documented history of a serious psychiatric or
behavioral disorder, including but not limited to an eating disorder,
suicidal behaviors, or deliberate, self-inflicted injury MENTAL OR
BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ISSUE OR HAS EXPERIENCED SIGNIFICANT TRAUMA;
or

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 22-7-604.7 as
follows:

21 22-7-604.7. School quality review pilot program - creation repeal. (1) BEGINNING WITH THE 2016-17 SCHOOL YEAR, THE
DEPARTMENT SHALL OPERATE A SCHOOL QUALITY REVIEW PILOT PROGRAM
TO CREATE A BASE FOR A QUALITATIVE MEASURE OF THE PERFORMANCE
OF ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES. THE GOAL OF THE PILOT
PROGRAM IS TO DETERMINE WHETHER ON-SITE REVIEW OF AN
ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUS IS AN EFFECTIVE METHOD OF

1 ACCURATELY MEASURING QUALITATIVE ASPECTS OF THE ALTERNATIVE 2 EDUCATION CAMPUS'S PERFORMANCE. THE PILOT PROGRAM WILL APPLY TO 3 PERFORMANCE REVIEWS PREPARED PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-11-210 FOR 4 THE 2016-17 TO 2018-19 SCHOOL YEARS.

5 (2) (a) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SELECT NO FEWER THAN TEN 6 ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE PILOT 7 PROGRAM. A PARTICIPATING CAMPUS IS NOT REOUIRED TO SUBMIT DATA 8 IN SUPPORT OF OTHER QUALITATIVE MEASURES THAT THE STATE BOARD 9 MAY ADOPT PURSUANT TO SECTION 22-11-210(1)(b) IN REVIEWING THE 10 PERFORMANCE OF ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES. THE 11 DEPARTMENT SHALL IMPLEMENT THE PILOT PROGRAM TO ENSURE THAT 12 EACH PARTICIPATING ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUS RECEIVES AN 13 ANNUAL ON-SITE SCHOOL QUALITY REVIEW DURING WHICH THE REVIEWER 14 USES A RUBRIC TO EVALUATE HOW WELL THE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION 15 CAMPUS IS ORGANIZED TO SUPPORT STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.

16 (b) IN OPERATING THE PILOT PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL: 17

(I) DESIGN THE REVIEW RUBRIC;

18 (II) CREATE THE PROCEDURES AND PROTOCOLS FOR THE REVIEW 19 AND FOR DOCUMENTING THE RESULTS, INCLUDING WHO CONDUCTS THE 20 REVIEW AND WHETHER THE REVIEWER IS AN INDIVIDUAL OR A TEAM OF 21 INDIVIDUALS:

22 (III) RECOMMEND TO THE STATE BOARD THE MANNER IN WHICH 23 THE RESULTS OF THE SCHOOL QUALITY REVIEW ARE INCLUDED IN THE 24 ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUS'S PERFORMANCE EVALUATION UNDER 25 SECTION 22-11-210; AND

26 (IV)REVIEW AND SUMMARIZE THE RESULTS OF THE PILOT 27 PROGRAM.

(3) NO LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 1, 2019, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL
 REVIEW THE RESULTS OF THE PILOT PROGRAM AND RECOMMEND TO THE
 STATE BOARD WHETHER TO EXPAND THE USE OF SCHOOL QUALITY
 REVIEWS TO OTHER ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES AS AN EFFECTIVE
 METHOD OF ACCURATELY MEASURING QUALITATIVE ASPECTS OF THE
 ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION CAMPUSES' PERFORMANCE.

(4) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2020.

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8 SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
