#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE ELIMINATION OF BRAND INSPECTIONS FOR REGISTERED EQUINE LIVESTOCK.

### **Bill Summary**

Current law requires brand inspections on all livestock whenever sold or moved interstate or intrastate. The bill exempts registered equine livestock from the inspection requirements.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	<b>SECTION 1.</b> In Colorado Revised Statutes, 35-41-104, amend
2	(1.5) as follows:
3	35-41-104. Board's authority to impose fees and charges -
4	rules - definition. (1.5) Equine livestock. (a) The board is hereby
5	authorized to levy and collect, through authorized brand inspectors, a
6	per-head inspection fee in an amount determined by the board by rule on
7	all UNREGISTERED equine livestock inspected. The inspection fee
8	established pursuant to this paragraph (a) shall apply when any
9	UNREGISTERED equine livestock are being consigned to a
10	Colorado-licensed public livestock market.
11	(b) In addition, the board is authorized to levy and collect, through
12	authorized brand inspectors, a minimum fee in an amount determined by
13	the board by rule from each person, company, or corporation requesting
14	the brand inspection or from whom a brand inspection is required by law.
15	The minimum fee shall be due and payable to the inspector when the
16	inspector arrives at the designated inspection point, whether or not an
17	inspection of the livestock actually takes place.
18	(c) Brand inspectors shall not inspect registered equine
19	LIVESTOCK.
20	(d) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (1.5), "REGISTERED
21	EQUINE" MEANS A HORSE THAT IS REGISTERED WITH A:
22	(I) Breed association; or
23	(II) PERFORMANCE ORGANIZATION THAT HAS A COMPETITION
24	LICENSE FOR EACH HORSE.
25	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
26	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
27	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

- 2 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
- 3 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
- 4 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
- 5 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- 6 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
