A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE EXPANSION OF PENALTY MITIGATION UNDER THE
 102 ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LAWS FOR VENDORS MEETING THE
 103 DEFINITION OF A "RESPONSIBLE VENDOR" AS PROVIDED BY LAW.

Bill Summary

The bill requires state and local liquor licensing authorities to consider it a mitigating factor for certain violations of the state alcohol beverage laws, including sales to minors, sales to visibly intoxicated patrons, and other violations approved by rule of the state licensing authority, if a licensee meets the requirements of a "responsible vendor" SENATE Amended 2nd Reading March 10, 2016





as defined by law.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-47-202, amend
3 (2) (a) (I) (E) as follows:

12-47-202. Duties of state licensing authority. (2) (a) (I) Rules made pursuant to paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of this section may cover, but shall not be limited to, the following subjects:

7 Inspections, investigations, searches, seizures, and such (E) 8 activities as may become necessary from time to time, including a range 9 of penalties for use by licensing authorities, which shall include 10 aggravating and mitigating factors to be considered, when persons under 11 twenty-one years of age are utilized to investigate sales of alcohol 12 beverages by liquor licensees to underage persons WHEN LICENSEES' 13 EMPLOYEES VIOLATE CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 46 OF THIS TITLE 14 AND THIS ARTICLE INCLUDING THE SALE OR SERVICE OF ALCOHOL 15 BEVERAGES TO PERSONS UNDER TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE OR TO 16 VISIBLY INTOXICATED PERSONS;

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-47-601, amend
(9) as follows:

12-47-601. Suspension - revocation - fines. (9) When penalizing
a vendor who has violated section 12-47-901 (1) (a) by serving a minor
during an underage compliance check PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 46 OF THIS
TITLE AND THIS ARTICLE THAT PROHIBIT THE SERVICE OF AN ALCOHOL
BEVERAGE TO A MINOR OR A VISIBLY INTOXICATED PERSON, state and local
licensing authorities shall consider it a mitigating factor if the vendor is
a responsible alcohol beverage vendor as defined by part 10 of this

article. IN ADDITION, THE STATE LICENSING AUTHORITY BY RULE MAY
 INCLUDE OTHER VIOLATIONS OF ARTICLE 46 OF THIS TITLE AND THIS
 ARTICLE THAT LICENSING AUTHORITIES SHALL CONSIDER FOR MITIGATION
 IF THE VENDOR QUALIFIES AS A RESPONSIBLE ALCOHOL BEVERAGE
 VENDOR.

6 **SECTION 3.** Act subject to petition - effective date -7 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following 8 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the 9 general assembly (August 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 10 2016); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 11 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, 12 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part 13 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election 14 to be held in November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the 15 date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

(2) This act applies to violations of articles 46 and 47 of title 12,
Colorado Revised Statutes, occurring on or after the applicable effective
date of this act.
