**HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 04-1013**

101     **CONCERNING SUPPORT FOR THE FEDERAL MARRIAGE AMENDMENT.**

1           WHEREAS, Our Creator, who endowed all people with certain  
2 unalienable rights, also established the union of one man and one woman  
3 as the first and most essential institution in society; and

4           WHEREAS, Throughout human history, the family of one man,  
5 one woman, and their children has been the core social unit of healthy  
6 and flourishing cultures; and

7           WHEREAS, Recently there have been serious attempts to change  
8 the historical definition of marriage through legislation and judicial  
9 action; and

10          WHEREAS, Colorado's Representative to the United States  
11 Congress from our Fourth Congressional District, Marilyn Musgrave, has  
12 introduced the Federal Marriage Amendment; and

13          WHEREAS, Colorado's U.S. Senator Wayne Allard is the prime  
14 sponsor of the Federal Marriage Amendment in the United States Senate;
