101 CONCERNING GRANTING AUTHORITY TO A PREGNANT MINOR TO  
102 APPROVE PERINATAL MEDICAL CARE FOR THE MINOR'S  
103 PREGNANCY INTENDED TO RESULT IN A LIVE BIRTH OF A CHILD,  
104 AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, LIMITING THE AUTHORITY TO  
105 APPROVING PRENATAL, DELIVERY, AND POST-DELIVERY  
106 MEDICAL CARE RELATED TO THE INTENDED LIVE BIRTH OF A  
107 CHILD.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** Part 1 of article 22 of title 13, Colorado Revised  
3 Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION to  
4 read:

5           **13-22-103.5. Minors - consent for medical care - pregnancy.**

6 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A PREGNANT MINOR  
7 MAY AUTHORIZE PRENATAL, DELIVERY, AND POST-DELIVERY MEDICAL  
8 CARE FOR HERSELF RELATED TO THE INTENDED LIVE BIRTH OF A CHILD.

9           **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,  
10 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate  
11 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
