A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING PERSONS AUTHORIZED AS PEACE OFFICERS IN COLORADO.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not necessarily reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted.)

Clarifies peace officer status for municipal court marshals and public transit officers. Eliminates the option of a municipal court marshal receiving reserve officer training in lieu of basic peace officer standards and training board certification training.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. 16-2.5-101 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read:
3	16-2.5-101. Peace officer - description - general authority.
4	(1) A person who is included within the provisions of this article and
5	who meets all standards imposed by law on a peace officer is a peace
6	officer, and, notwithstanding any other provision of law, no person other
7	than a person designated in this article is a peace officer. A peace officer
8	may be certified by the peace officers standards and training board
9	pursuant to part 3 of article 31 of title 24, C.R.S., and, at a minimum, has
10	the authority to enforce all laws of the state of Colorado while acting
11	within the scope of his or her authority and in the performance of his or
12	her duties, UNLESS OTHERWISE LIMITED WITHIN THIS PART 1.
13	SECTION 2. 16-2.5-145, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended
14	to read:
15	16-2.5-145. Municipal court marshal. A municipal court
16	marshal employed by a municipality is WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A
17	MUNICIPALITY AND IS SPECIFICALLY DESIGNATED a peace officer BY THE
18	MUNICIPALITY IS A PEACE OFFICER while engaged in the performance of
19	his or her duties. whose authority THE AUTHORITY OF SUCH A MUNICIPAL
20	COURT MARSHAL shall be limited to providing security for the municipal
21	court, transporting, detaining, and maintaining control over prisoners,
22	executing all arrest warrants within the municipal court and its grounds,
23	executing municipal court arrest warrants within the municipal limits, and
24	serving legal process issued by the municipal court within the municipal
25	limits. and who A MUNICIPAL COURT MARSHAL shall be certified by the
26	P.O.S.T. board. or receive the training required for a reserve officer
27	pursuant to section 16-2.5-110.

1	SECTION 3. 16-2.5-146 (1), Colorado Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read:
3	16-2.5-146. Public transit officer - definitions. (1) A public
4	transit officer WHO IS employed by a public transportation entity, as
5	defined in section 18-4-801 (2), C.R.S., is AND IS SPECIFICALLY
6	DESIGNATED a peace officer BY THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION ENTITY IS
7	A PEACE OFFICER while engaged in the performance of his or her duties.
8	A public transit officer's authority shall be limited to the enforcement of
9	all laws of the state of Colorado and the provision of security for
10	passengers, employees, and property of the public transportation entity on
11	public transportation vehicles, as defined in section 18-4-801 (3), C.R.S.,
12	and at public transportation facilities. A public transit officer's authority
13	shall include the power of arrest based upon probable cause while
14	engaged in the performance of his or her duties. A public transit officer
15	shall be certified by the P.O.S.T. board.
16	SECTION 4. Effective date. This act shall take effect July 1,
17	2007.
18	SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
19	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
20	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
