20 OF SECTION 18-13-122 OR 12-47-901 (1) (b) OR (1) (c), C.R.S., AND THE  
21 PERSON HAS BEEN CITED FOR A VIOLATION OF SECTION 18-13-122 OR 12-  
22 47-901 (1) (b) OR (1) (c), C.R.S., PREVIOUS TO THE CURRENT CHARGE.".

26 line 8, strike "SHALL" and substitute "MAY";

28 line 9, after the period, add "NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISIONS  
29 OF THIS SECTION, THE NOTICE SHALL BE RETURNABLE NO LESS THAN  
30 THIRTY DAYS FROM THE DATE OF THE NOTICE. AT THE HEARING, THE  
31 ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER SHALL ORDER THE REVOCATION IF THE  
32 OFFICER DETERMINES THE PERSON HAS PLEAD GUILTY TO OR BEEN  
33 CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF SECTION 18-13-122 OR 12-47-901 (1) (b)  
34 OR (1) (c), C.R.S., AND THE PERSON HAS BEEN CITED FOR A VIOLATION OF  
35 SECTION 18-13-122 OR 12-47-901 (1) (b) OR (1) (c), C.R.S., PREVIOUS TO  
36 THE CURRENT CHARGE. IF THE ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER FINDS  
37 THE PERSON'S CASE HAS BEEN DISMISSED, THE OFFICER SHALL DISMISS THE  
38 NOTICE OF REVOCATION. IF THE ADMINISTRATIVE HEARING OFFICER FINDS  
39 THE PERSON'S CASE HAS NOT PROCEEDED TO FINAL JUDGMENT, THE  
40 HEARING OFFICER SHALL STAY THE REVOCATION UNTIL DISPOSITION OF  
41 THE PERSON'S CASE AND ORDER ANOTHER HEARING WITHIN SIXTY DAYS OF  
42 THE DATE OF THE FINDING.".
