26 publicly read. Reading of the bill at length was dispensed with by
27 unanimous consent.

29 **SCR06-001** by Senator(s) Evans; also Representative(s) Gallegos--
30 Submitting to the registered electors of the state of
31 Colorado an amendment to section 3.5 of article X of the
32 constitution of the state of Colorado, concerning the
33 extension of the existing property tax exemption for
34 qualifying seniors to any United States military veteran
35 who is one hundred percent permanently disabled due to
36 a service-connected disability, and, in connection
37 therewith, authorizing the state to retain and spend excess
38 state revenues above the statutory excess state revenues
39 cap in an amount equal to the amount paid annually by the
40 state to compensate each local governmental entity that
41 receives property tax revenues for the next amount of
42 property tax revenues lost as a result of the property tax
43 exemption for qualifying seniors and disabled veterans.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am returning to you House Bill 06-1193, "Concerning Protection For All Health Care Workers Who Report Patient Safety Information." I vetoed this bill as of 4:03 p.m. today and this letter sets forth my reasons for doing so.

While the bill is well intentioned, I am concerned that H.B. 1193 could result in severe unintended consequences. This bill was presented as a compromise; however, it has come to my attention that strong concerns remain, as expressed by hospitals including Denver Health.

Denver Health states that the bill would "create serious problems for Colorado hospitals" and that it "creates an expensive, cumbersome and inefficient process which is not focused on patient safety or quality."

H.B. 1193 would establish a new statute that is duplicative of and separate from the state's existing statute on unlawful employment practices. This could result in excessive and unnecessary lawsuits and because of the very general definitions in this bill, serious legal claims could be brought forward for minor disciplinary actions.

Denver Health states the bill would "likely open the door to legal claims for such minor disciplinary actions as 'reprimands' and 'admonishments' or even

1 a perceived 'threat of any such discipline' and also for such other minor actions
2 taken by employers, including 'changes in work hours'."

3
4 In addition, H.B. 1193 would create an open-ended process with no time limit
5 regarding when violations must be reported. The bill gives an employee the
6 ability to raise allegations of retaliation many years after the disclosure,
7 potentially resulting in claims based on inaccurate and incomplete information.

8
9 Further, there is concern that this legislation could actually contribute to
10 hospitals keeping sub-standard employees on the payroll due to the fear of false
11 claims and future lawsuits.

12
13 This cumbersome process also has the potential of disclosing a patient's
14 confidential health information in a public hearing in an attempt to prove that
15 an employee's claim may not be true. H.B. 1193 places the burden on the
16 employer to demonstrate that the employee was not acting in good faith and
17 knew the information was false when making the report.

18
19 I strongly believe in high standards for the quality and care of patients. Health
20 care, however, is already one of our most highly regulated industries.
21 Currently, patients and health care workers alike have many established
22 opportunities to report patient safety and quality issues, such as those provided
23 by the Board of Medical Examiners, the Board of Nursing, the Board of
24 Pharmacy and other regulatory agencies. Additionally, our state statutes require
25 hospitals to have an established grievance mechanism that allows patients the
26 right to voice concerns, including the right to submit complaints to the Colorado
27 Department of Public Health and Environment.

29 I agree with the hospitals' ultimate concern that H.B. 1193 would be
30 counterproductive in terms of increasing patient safety and quality of care.
