46 no later than July 15, 2006, that the requirement set forth in paragraph (b)  
47 of this subsection (2) has been met.".

36 GREATER OF ONE HUNDRED ELIGIBLE ELECTORS RESIDING WITHIN THE  
37 BOUNDARIES OF THE SPECIAL DISTRICT OR THE AREA TO BE INCLUDED  
38 WITHIN THE SPECIAL DISTRICT OR TWENTY PERCENT OF SUCH ELECTORS  
39 HAVE CAST BALLOTS IN SUCH ELECTIONS.
