<u>HB06-1031</u> be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 2, line 5, strike "ONE HUNDRED" and substitute "UP TO ONE HUNDRED".

<u>HB06-1032</u> be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

HB06-1049 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 2, strike lines 14 through 19 and substitute the following:

"recreational purposes OR FOR WHICH THE LANDOWNER HAS ACQUIESCED TO PUBLIC USE OF EXISTING TRAILS THAT HAVE HISTORICALLY BEEN USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES. "Land", as used in this subsection (2), does not include real property, buildings, or portions thereof which are not the subject of a lease, easement, or other right of use granted to a public entity; EXCEPT THAT, LAND ON WHICH A LANDOWNER HAS ACQUIESCED TO PUBLIC USE OF EXISTING TRAILS THAT HAVE HISTORICALLY BEEN USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES NEED NOT BE SUBJECT TO A LEASE, EASEMENT, OR OTHER RIGHT OF USE GRANTED TO A PUBLIC ENTITY. NOTHING IN THIS SUBPARAGRAPH (II) SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO CREATE A PRESCRIPTIVE EASEMENT ON LANDS ON WHICH A LANDOWNER HAS ACQUIESCED TO PUBLIC USE OF EXISTING TRAILS THAT HAVE HISTORICALLY BEEN USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR THE INCIDENTAL USE OF SUCH PRIVATE RECREATIONAL PURPOSES. PROPERTY FOR RECREATIONAL PURPOSES SHALL NOT ESTABLISH OR PRESUME FACTS TO SUPPORT LAND USE CLASSIFICATION OR ZONING.".
