Currently, physical education teachers must, at a minimum, hold a bachelor's degree in the liberal arts and go through the normal rigors of licensure as a teacher in a public school. In addition, teachers are required to 14 take at least six credit hours of professional development every five years in order to renew their licenses. H.B. 1021 would impose 24 credit hours of physical education instruction for aspiring teachers before they would be eligible for hire, and would force current P.E. teachers to go back to school in order to keep their jobs.

School districts already have the authority to require more stringent hiring standards for their physical education instructors. Idon't believe it is necessary or prudent for the State to put up additional hurdles for aspiring P.E. teachers. I have always been an advocate for qualified, capable teachers in our schools, and I see no evidence that our current licensure requirements are insufficient, or that our physical education teachers are providing subpar instruction to our children.
