9 Ladies and Gentlemen:

10  
11 I am filing with the Secretary of State House Bill 06-1215, "Concerning  
12 a supplemental appropriation to the Department of Education." I will  
13 neither sign nor veto House Bill 06-1215. Therefore, this bill becomes  
14 law at 12:01 a.m. on April 4, 2006. This letter sets forth my reasons for  
15 letting this bill become law without my signature.  
16

17 In the 2005 Legislative Session, the General Assembly increased the  
18 General Fund appropriation for State Share of Districts' Total Program  
19 Funding by \$178.9 million, creating a maintenance of effort (MOE) of  
20 7.6 percent when the Colorado Constitution required a 5.0 percent MOE.  
21 This action resulted in \$61.8 million more General Fund being  
22 appropriated than was required by law.  
23

24 Late last year, I submitted to the Joint Budget Committee several  
25 supplemental requests seeking additional funding for K-12 education.  
26 My first priority was to fund the actual number of pupils enrolled in  
27 public schools after the official count was certified by the Department of  
28 Education. I submitted to the General Assembly a request seeking this  
29 required funding, and I asked that the source of funds come from the  
30 State Education Fund. I also requested the General Assembly provide  
31 additional funding for public school capital construction so that critical  
32 and immediate life and safety issues could be addressed. To accomplish  
33 this, I recommended replacing a portion of the existing General Fund  
34 appropriation with dollars from the State Education Fund. It is important  
35 to note that even with this change in the mix of funding, there would still  
36 be an increase in funding for education this year.  
37

38 Unfortunately, House Bill 06-1215 increases the MOE to 8.1 percent, or  
39 \$10.4 million more than the original appropriation. This action results  
40 in an appropriation of \$72.2 million more General Fund than required by  
41 law. It has no impact on the amount of money going to Colorado's  
42 public schools, but will have dramatic effects forever on the State's  
43 financial footing. This occurs because Amendment 23 requires growth  
44 from the prior year's level, with only limited exceptions. In FY 2005-06  
45 and FY 2006-07, the General Assembly's appropriation for the State  
46 Share of Districts' Total Program Funding has the effect of taking away  
47 General Fund monies from other statewide priorities when a different  
48 funding source – the State Education Fund – is available and specifically  
49 permitted for such a use by law. As a result, I do not support an increase  
50 in the FY 2005-06 MOE as proposed in House Bill 06-1215.

51  
52 Meanwhile, during the balancing of the FY 2006-07 Long Bill (House  
53 Bill 06-1385), the Joint Budget Committee lowered the MOE in FY  
54 2005-06 and FY 2006-07. The mechanism by which the Joint Budget  
55 Committee proposed the reduction in MOE was to amend House Bill 06-  
56 1215, after its enactment into law. Therefore, to allow this reduction in

1 the MOE in FY 2005-06 to occur, I must let House Bill 06-1215 become  
2 law.

3  
4 I believe that the Joint Budget Committee's actions in House Bill  
5 06-1385 are a step in the right direction. However, work still remains in  
6 concluding the supplemental appropriations process for FY 2005-06 and  
7 setting the new budget for FY 2006-07.

8  
9 For these reasons, I am allowing this bill to become law without my  
10 signature.
