'SECTION 4. Appropriation. (1) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the operational account of the severance tax trust fund created in section 39-29-109, Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2006, the sum of one million six thousand nine hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$1,006,927) and 2.2 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the ongoing implementation of House 26 Bill 05-1177. Of such sum, one hundred fifty-one thousand six hundred seventy-three dollars (\$151,673) and 1 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the office of the governor for allocation to the director of compact negotiations; and eight hundred fifty-five 30 thousand two hundred fifty-four dollars (\$855,254) and 1.2 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the department of natural resources for allocation to the Colorado water conservation board, to be used for basin roundtable meetings, interbasin compact committee 34 meetings, a water needs assessment refinement, and public education and outreach.

(2) The moneys appropriated in subsection (1) of this section shall remain available for the designated purposes until they are fully expended.".
