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(3) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the operational account of the severance tax trust fund created in section 39-29-109 (1) (a) (II), Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the governor's 56 office, for allocation to the office of energy management and

conservation, pursuant to section 39-29-109 (1.5) (b) (II), Colorado Revised Statutes, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, the sum of four million dollars (\$4,000,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act.
