FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON HB06-1169

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on HB06-1169, concerning protecting personal information in domestic case filings that are open to inspection by the public, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

1. That the House accede to the Senate amendments made to bill, as the amendments appear in the rerevised bill.

2. That, under the authority granted the committee to consider matters not at issue between the two houses, the following amendments be recommended:

Amend rerevised bill, strike everything below the enacting clause and substitute the following:

"**SECTION 1.** 13-3-101, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

13-3-101. State court administrator - repeal. (8) (a) THE STATE COURT ADMINISTRATOR SHALL CONVENE A COMMITTEE OF INTERESTED PARTIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NEWS MEDIA, ATTORNEYS WHO PRACTICE FAMILY LAW, AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE COURTS, TO IDENTIFY AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING ACCESS TO RECORDS PERTAINING TO DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE ACTIONS. THE COMMITTEE SHALL CONSIDER ISSUES, WHICH INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, PROTECTION OF LITIGANTS FROM IDENTITY THEFT, LIMITATIONS OF DISCLOSURE OF PERSONAL FINANCIAL RECORDS AND RECORDS THAT COULD ENDANGER THE SAFETY OF CHILDREN. THE COMMITTEE SHALL ALSO CONSIDER THE IMPORTANCE OF TRANSPARENCY IN GOVERNMENT AND OPEN ACCESS TO PUBLIC INFORMATION. THE STATE COURT ADMINISTRATOR SHALL REPORT ANY RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE TO THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 1, 2006.

(b) This subsection (8) is repealed, effective January 1, 2007.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.".

COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE REPORTS

FIRST REPORT OF FIRST CONFERENCE COMMITTEE ON SB06-138

To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on SB06-138, concerning the requirement that gasoline contain at least a specified percentage of ethanol by volume, and making an appropriation therefor, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

1. That the House recede from its amendments made to the bill, as said amendments appear in the rerevised bill, and the following amendment be substituted therefor:

Amend reengrossed bill, page 4, line 7, strike "ACCURATELY REFLECT THE ETHANOL" and substitute "STATE THAT THE PRODUCT BEING DISPENSED CONTAINS ETHANOL.";

strike lines 8 through 10.

2. That, under the authority granted the committee to consider matters not at issue between the two houses, the following amendments be recommended:

Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 5, strike "SEVENTY-FIVE" and substitute "AT LEAST SEVENTY-FIVE".

Page 3, line 1, strike "COLORADO," and substitute "COLORADO ON A STATE-WIDE, AGGREGATE BASIS,";

line 22, strike "IS AT LEAST TEN CENTS PER GALLON HIGHER THAN" and substitute "EXCEEDS";

after line 23, insert the following:

"(5) (a) IN DETERMINING WHETHER OR NOT THE REQUIREMENT SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION IS MET, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, ON A MONTHLY BASIS BETWEEN NOVEMBER AND APRIL, FIRST DETERMINE IF AT LEAST SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF ALL FUEL SOLD IN COLORADO ON A STATE-WIDE, AGGREGATE BASIS CONTAINED TEN PERCENT ETHANOL BY VOLUME.

(b) IF, AFTER GIVING CREDIT TO EACH GALLON OF E10, E85, AND CELLULOSIC ETHANOL SOLD, AT LEAST SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF ALL FUEL SOLD IN COLORADO ON A STATE-WIDE, AGGREGATE BASIS CONTAINED TEN PERCENT ETHANOL BY VOLUME, THEN THE REQUIREMENT OF SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE DEEMED SATISFIED, AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TAKE NO FURTHER ACTION.

(c) If the requirement set forth in subsection (1) of this section has not been met on a monthly basis between November and April, the department shall assess penalties pursuant to section 8-20-104, C.R.S., against each nonexempt distributor or entity required to file IRS form 637 that did not achieve the seventy-five percent requirement at the distributor's or entity's facility.

(d) Penalties assessed pursuant to section $8\-20\-104, C.R.S.,$ against each nonexempt distributor or entity required to file IRS form 637 shall not exceed five hundred dollars per month.".

Renumber succeeding subsections accordingly.

MESSAGE FROM THE GOVERNOR

May 4, 2006

Ladies and Gentleman:

I am filing with the Secretary of State Senate Bill 06-145, "Concerning the authority of a local government to impose a fee on certain medical providers for purposes of obtaining federal financial participation under Medicaid for unreimbursed Medicaid costs." I will neither sign nor veto Senate Bill 06-145. Therefore, this bill becomes law at 12:01 a.m. on May 5, 2006. This letter sets forth my reasons for letting this bill become law without my signature.

Senate Bill 145 addresses a serious problem facing Colorado's health care providers: unreimbursed costs for treatment of our Medicaid population. The legislation permits local governments to impose a fee on health-care providers, allowing those providers to then draw an equal amount from the federal government to be used to reimburse for services to Medicaid patients. I am hopeful that S.B. 145, without requiring additional General Fund dollars, will generate additional federal revenue to help with our state's growing unreimbursed costs. While unreimbursed health care costs directly hurt our hospitals and physicians, they also harm the general population and employers, who pay higher rates to offset money lost from Medicaid patients.

But in order for this plan to work, the State will first have to gain approval from the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). Approval is uncertain, especially in light of the increased scrutiny CMS is currently giving to such changes in state plans in order to generate additional federal revenue. Furthermore, the Colorado Department of Health Care Policy and Financing has still not ascertained the legality of S.B. 145.

I am also concerned about the manner in which the fee will be imposed. S.B. 145 sets a 39 maximum fee; however, it does not set a single consistent statewide rate. This could 40 create difficulties for state and local tax policies and allow for more local taxing districts at 41 a time when we should be supporting a simplified tax system. 42

While I have some reservations about S.B. 145, I trust this legislation's many supporters, such as the Colorado Health and Hospital Association, Colorado Counties, and the Homecare Association. I agree with them that Colorado should take advantage of available federal funds to address the growing problem of unreimbursed medical costs.

Accordingly, I am allowing this bill to become law without my signature.
