Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB06-026 be postponed indefinitely.

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB06-007 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee on Appropriations with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 4, line 3, strike "DOLLARS," and substitute "DOLLARS, ADJUSTED FOR INFLATION AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBSECTION (3), AS AMENDED,";

line 6, after the period, add "FOR PURPOSES OF THIS PARAGRAPH (b), "INFLATION" MEANS THE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS, CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR DENVER-BOULDER, ALL ITEMS, ALL URBAN CONSUMERS, OR ITS SUCCESSOR INDEX.";

line 10, strike "ON" and substitute "FROM".

Page 7, line 1, strike "DOLLARS," and substitute "DOLLARS, ADJUSTED FOR INFLATION AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, AS AMENDED,";

line 3, after the period, add "FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, "INFLATION" MEANS THE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS, CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR DENVER-BOULDER, ALL ITEMS, ALL URBAN CONSUMERS, OR ITS SUCCESSOR INDEX.".

Education After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends that SB06-042 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation.

Amend printed bill, page 10, after line 19, insert the following:

"SECTION 5. 22-30.5-112 (2) (a.8), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22-30.5-112. Charter schools - financing - guidelines. (2) (a.8) (I) For the 2000-01 budget year and budget years thereafter, the school district shall provide federally required educational services to students enrolled in charter schools on the same basis as such services are provided to students enrolled in other public schools of the school district. Each charter school shall pay an amount equal to the per pupil cost incurred by the school district in providing federally required educational services, multiplied by the number of students enrolled in the charter school. At either party's request, however, the charter school and the school district may negotiate and include in the charter contract alternate arrangements for the provision of and payment for federally required educational services.

(II) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH (a.8) TO THE CONTRARY, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL CALCULATE THE PER PUPIL COST OF PROVIDING FEDERALLY REQUIRED EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AFTER SUBTRACTING THE AMOUNT RECEIVED IN FEDERAL AND STATE MONEYS FOR PROVIDING SAID SERVICES.".
