Ballot Title: An amendment to Section 60 of Title 34 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado, concerning the composition of the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission and providing that no members of the Commission may be currently employed by, or have a substantial financial interest in, the oil and gas industry. **Text of Proposed Amendment:**

Section 34-60-104 of the Revised Statutes of Colorado is amended to read:

Be it Enacted by the People of the State of Colorado:

(2) (a) Effective July 1, 1994 2009, the commission shall consist of seven members appointed by the governor, with the consent of the senate. Two members shall be appointed from west of the continental divide, and, to the extent possible, consistent with this paragraph (a), the other members shall be appointed taking into account the need for geographical representation of other areas of the state with high levels of oil and gas activity or employment. Two members shall not be employed by the oil and gas industry and shall be individuals with formal training or substantial experience in agriculture, land reclamation, environmental protection, or soil conservation. Five members shall be individuals with substantial experience in the oil and gas industry, and at least two of said five members shall have a college degree in petroleum geology or petroleum engineering. No more than four members of the commission shall be members of the same political party.

Subsection (2)(c) is added and shall read:

(c) No member appointed to the Colorado Oil and Gas Conservation Commission shall be currently employed by, or have a significant financial interest in, the oil and gas industry.
