WHEREAS, By the Will of Divine Providence, our beloved former member, the Honorable Mildred H. Cresswell, departed this life on May 29, 1995, at the age of eighty-four; and

WHEREAS, Mildred H. Cresswell was born in Bolivar, Missouri, on May 31, 1910; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell served this state faithfully, representing Denver county as a member of the Colorado House of Representatives in the 46th General Assembly from 1967 to 1968; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell distinguished herself as a member of the House, serving as a member of the Health, Welfare, and Institutions Committee, the Judiciary Committee, the Transportation and Highways Committee, and the House Services Committee; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell also served as the Senate assignable stenographer in 1947 and held the position of Senate secretary for twelve years; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell attended Barnes Business College and the University of Denver; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell was actively involved in several organizations in her community, including the Colorado Republican Party, for which she had served as vice-chair, the Denver Women's Club, Montview United Methodist Church, Friends of the Library, Loveland Book Club, and also served as a Junior Great Books leader and a community volunteer in Loveland; and

WHEREAS, Representative Cresswell's position always was "Think well, vote well, Cresswell."; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that we, the members of the House of Representatives of the Sixtieth General Assembly, pay tribute to the years of dedicated public service by Representative Cresswell and express our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by her death; now, therefore,
