WHEREAS, The late Senator Taylor served his state well and faithfully as a member of the Senate, with the longest continuing service of any legislator in the history of the State of Colorado; and

WHEREAS, Throughout his years in the Colorado Senate, Senator Taylor served in most of the Democratic party's leadership positions, and, as President of the Senate, filled the posts of acting Lieutenant Governor and acting Governor; and

WHEREAS, Senator Taylor distinguished himself as a man of dignity, restraint, foresight, and knowledge during his long service for the State of Colorado and his constituents; and

WHEREAS, It is most fitting that we, the members of the Fifty-first General Assembly, give recognition to the devoted public service of the late Senator Taylor and express our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Fifty-first General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:

That, in the death of the Honorable Senator Taylor, the people of the State of Colorado have lost an outstanding citizen and a most respected legislator, and that we, the members of this General Assembly, do hereby extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of his family and pay tribute to a man of character, integrity, and ability.
