Montana Wanda Smith

Services for Montana Wanda Smith, a former Colorado state representative, will be at 10 a.m. Wednesday in Fairmount. The body will be cremated.

A resident of 3269 Julian St., Mrs. Smith died Saturday in St. Anthony Hospital after a short illness. She was 66.

Mrs. Smith was born Oct. 25, 1914, in Butte, Mont. She was married to Norton Alanzo Smith on March 1, 1937, in Bakersfield, Calif. They were divorced.

She was a civil engineer for the Colorado Department of Wildlife and a state representative for Gunnison, Hinsdale and Saguache counties from 1947 to 1951. She also was an engineer for the Denver Water Board, the Rocky Mountain Arsenal and the Boeing Aircraft Co. in Seattle, Wash.

Mrs. Smith was a member of the Order of the Eastern Star and a secretary of the organization's Metron Club. She also was a past worthy high priestess of the White Shrine of Jerusalem and a conductress of the Columbine Court No. 15 Amaranth of Aurora.

Surviving are two sons, Burton Earle Smith and Byrne C. Smith, both of Lake City; a sister, Dorothy Jo Woodbury of Andrews, Texas; and a brother, Tom E. French of Poncha Springs.
