

could backfire. "I'm concerned that we not inadvertently do something that compels the Soviet Union to take action that would set back the whole case of freedom around the world," Bush said after a meeting with congressional leaders.

Administration officials said Bush, who appeared a day ago to be on the brink of imposing economic penalties, decided to wait after reports from Moscow that U.S. sanctions could wind up making the situation worse in Lithuania.

ical Center in Loveland and was a member of the Loveland Rotary Club for 22 years. He was a member of the choir of Mountain View Presbyterian Church and served on the session of that church for three years.

He was a member of the Scottish Rite Consistory of the Masonic Lodge in Denver. He was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Boulder and the Boulder Rotary Club.

He is survived by sons, Stanley A. Black and Dale Black, both of Boulder; seven grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

Memorial services will be held 1 p.m. Thursday at the First Presbyterian Church in Boulder. The Rev. John Hess and the Rev. Billie Martin will officiate.

Interment of cremated remains will be at 4 p.m. at Loveland Burial Park.
