**MEMORIAL ON HONORABLE JOHN H. CROWLEY,
DECEASED**

(By Senator Bashor)

Word having been received of the death of the
Honorable John H. Crowley, a former member of
this body, it is befitting that we, in our humble way,
pay tribute to his memory.

Senator Crowley was in truth and in fact a
state builder.

As an irrigationist he did much to bring the arid
sections of the Arkansas Valley under the develop-
ing influence of water applied to dry earth, thus up-
building that part of the state commercially far
more than it would have been upbuilt had he not
lived.

As an agriculturist he devoted his especial at-
tention to the growth of choice fruits and melons
thus enriching the valley which he called "Home"
and bringing into national prominence the fruits
and melons of the state of his choice.

As a state senator he aided materially in the
enacting of those advanced laws that are now on our
statute books which have more evenly distributed
the individual burdens of government and citizen-
ship.

As a husband and father he not only cherished
but obeyed those finer principles of human kind that
make the fireside the real foundation stone of all
American institutions.

As a citizen he played well all the parts that were assigned unto him whether they were those of friendship to mankind, devotion to great and fundamental principles or love of home, church and country.

Having full knowledge of Senator Crowley's life and realizing the loss his local community, the Arkansas Valley and the State of Colorado, have sustained in his death, now
