WHEREAS, By the Will of Divine Providence, our beloved former member, the Honorable Donald Howard MacManus, departed this life on December 10, 1989, at the age of sixty-one; and

WHEREAS, Senator MacManus was born September 10, 1928, in Des Moines, Iowa; and

WHEREAS, Senator MacManus graduated from Golden High School in 1946 and served as a member of the United States Army in Korea from 1946 to 1948; and

WHEREAS, Senator MacManus married LaVerna Van Meter in 1950 and, professionally, served as chief executive officer of the Rocky Mountain Food Dealers Association and director of western operations for the Food Marketing Institute and on the national boards of the National Association of Retail Grocers and Food Industry Association Executives; and

WHEREAS, Senator MacManus served this state faithfully as a member of the Senate from 1968 until 1984 representing Adams County; and

WHEREAS, Senator MacManus distinguished himself as a member of the Senate committees on the Judiciary, Appropriations, and Transportation and as assistant minority leader and vice-chair of the Legislative Audit Committee, as well as serving as a member of the Advisory Board of the Colorado Highway Safety Division concurrently with his Senate service; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that we, the members of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly, pay tribute to the years of dedicated public service of Senator MacManus and express our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the House of Representatives concurring herein:

That, in the death of Donald Howard MacManus, the people of the State of Colorado have lost an outstanding citizen and public servant and that we, the members of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly, do hereby extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of his family and pay tribute to a man who served his state well and faithfully.
