WHEREAS, Representative Coloroso distinguished himself during his years of service as a champion for those with physical or developmental disabilities; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that we, the members of the Fifty-eighth General Assembly, pay tribute to the years of dedicated public service of the late Representative Coloroso and express our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now, therefore,
