33 **INTRODUCTION AND CONSIDERATION OF**  
34 **MEMORIAL**

36 The following memorial was read at length:

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38 **H. M. No. 1004, by Representatives Burns, McCormick,**  
39 **and Strang.**

41 *WHEREAS*, By the will of Divine Providence, our be-  
42 loved former member, the Honorable Meredith H. Morgan,  
43 departed this life on October 22, 1971, at the age of sixty-five  
44 years; and

1        *WHEREAS*, The late Representative Morgan served  
2 this state and particularly his constituency of Clear Creek,  
3 Eagle, Gilpin, Pitkin, and Summit counties well and faith-  
4 fully as a member of the House of Representatives in the  
5 Forty-third General Assembly; and

7        *WHEREAS*, It is fitting that we, the members of the  
8 House of Representatives, give recognition to the devoted  
9 public service of the late Representative Morgan and express  
10 our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now,  
11 therefore,

13        *Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the*  
14 *Forty-eighth General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

16        That, in the death of former Representative Morgan, the  
17 State of Colorado has lost one of its public-spirited citizens,  
18 and we, the members of this House of Representatives, do  
19 hereby extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to his widow  
20 and the members of his family and pay tribute to a man of  
21 integrity and ability who served this state well and faithfully;

24        *Be It Further Resolved*, That this Memorial be printed  
25 in the Journal of the House and a copy thereof be transmitted  
26 to Mrs. Lenore Morgan, the widow of our beloved former  
27 member, at Eagle, Colorado.

29        On motion of Representative McCormick the rules were  
30 suspended and **H. M. No. 1004** given immediate consideration  
31 and **adopted** by unanimous consent.

33        Representatives Strang, Knox, and Burns offered accol-  
34 ades to the memory of the late Representative Morgan.

49 man, Jackson, Lucero, Moore, Newman, Sonnenberg,  
50 Sooter, and Younglund; also Senators Anderson, Chance,  
51 DeBerard, Kinnie, Minister, Ohlson, Massari, and Ru-  
52 land—For an act concerning a tax on incomes for the  
53 support of public schools to effect property tax reduction;  
54 and imposing such tax on the adjusted gross income of  
55 individuals, trusts, and estates and the net income of  
56 corporations and cooperatives; and imposing limitations
