WHEREAS, George F. Jackson was born on Governor's Island, New York, on September 2, 1908; and

WHEREAS, George F. Jackson was a successful businessman as owner of Mountain Express Truck Line; and

WHEREAS, George F. Jackson was active in his community as a member of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, the Colorado Springs Lions Club, the Colorado Springs Chamber of Commerce, the Colorado Wildlife Federation, and the Colorado Motor Carriers' Association, and as national president of the Izaak Walton League; and

WHEREAS, George F. Jackson served on the Colorado Springs Park Board as a member of the mayor's watershed committee; and

WHEREAS, George F. Jackson served this state faithfully, representing El Paso county in the Colorado House of Representatives from 1965 to 1966 and in the state Senate from 1967 to 1974, where he distinguished himself as the Senate majority caucus leader from 1969 to 1972; and
