WHEREAS, By The Will of Divine Providence, our beloved former member, the Honorable Carl H. Gustafson, departed this life on January 3, 1989, at the age of 59; and

WHEREAS, Former Representative Gustafson served this state faithfully, representing the south-central districts of Denver county from 1966 until 1980; and

WHEREAS, Representative Gustafson distinguished himself as the House majority leader from 1971 to 1975 and from 1977 to 1979, and as a member of the house committees on Education; Business; Game, Fish, and Parks; Finance; State Affairs; Rules; and Labor; and

WHEREAS, Representative Gustafson served in the general assembly as a financial expert and was the chief sponsor of measures such as the creation of Colorado's no-fault automobile insurance law; the repeal of the state's inheritance tax; and the Fire and Police Pension Act; and

WHEREAS, Representative Gustafson served his community as Denver's revenue manager; as a bond consultant for the city and county of Denver, underwriting bond issues for Mile High Stadium, McNichols Sports Arena, and the Denver Center for the Performing Arts; as a member of the Fire and Police Pension Board; as a member of the Colorado Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education; as a regent for Dana College, Nebraska; as a lobbyist for the Denver Board of Education; and as a cofounder of Colostrust; and

WHEREAS, Representative Gustafson was a native and lifelong resident of Colorado, who served in the United States service and attended the University of Northern Colorado; and

WHEREAS, It is fitting that we, the members of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly, pay tribute to the years of dedicated public service of the late Representative Gustafson and express our deep regret and sorrow occasioned by his death; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That, in the death of Representative Carl H. Gustafson, the people of this state have lost a devoted public servant and an outstanding citizen and that we, the members of the Fifty-seventh General Assembly, do hereby extend our deep and heartfelt sympathy to the members of his family and pay tribute to a man who served his state well and faithfully.
