I am pleased to submit the Department of Public Safety (CDPS)'s 2020 Regulatory Agenda Report and 2021 Regulatory Agenda, in compliance with Colo. Rev. Stat. §2-7-203, as amended by House Bill 12-1008. The Department's 2021 Regulatory Agenda has also been submitted to the Colorado Secretary of State for publication in the Colorado Register, and will be posted to our website.

The Department's 2020 Regulatory Agenda Report provides a brief summary of all permanent, temporary and emergency rules reviewed, revised and adopted since the Department's 2020 Departmental Regulatory Agenda was filed on November 1, 2019, as well as the status, comments, and information relative to stakeholder input. Pursuant to Colo. Rev. Stat. § 24-4-103.3(4), the 2020 Regulatory Agenda Report also reflects the results of the Department's mandatory rule review activity over the past year. All permanent rules adopted by the Department, as reflected in the 2020 Regulatory Agenda Report, involved early stakeholder engagement, as described by the Department's protocol for public participation in rulemaking (available online at on the [CDPS Rules and Regulations webpage](http://cdpsdocs.state.co.us/edo/rulemaking/cdps_stakeholder_protocol_2020.pdf) (direct link to protocol document: http://cdpsdocs.state.co.us/edo/rulemaking/cdps_stakeholder_protocol_2020.pdf).
