Amend the Appropriations Committee amendment, as printed in Senate Journal, March 27, page 758, strike line 71 and substitute the following:

"Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 26, strike "\$136" and substitute "\$123.70".

Page 9, strike lines 25 and 26 and substitute the following:

"out of any moneys in the state public school fund created in section 22-54-114, Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of education, public school finance, for the state share of districts' total program funding, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, the sum of eight million nine hundred sixty-three thousand eight hundred thirty-two dollars (\$8,963,832), or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act."."

Amendment No. 4, by Senator Anderson

Amend the Appropriations Committee amendment, as printed in Senate Journal, March 27, page 758, strike line 71 and substitute the following:

"Amend reengrossed bill, page 9, after line 22, insert the following:

"**SECTION 9.** 24-75-102, Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SUBSECTION to read:

24-75-102. Appropriations expended, when - balance. (3) ANY MONEYS APPROPRIATED TO ALL DEPARTMENTS OF STATE GOVERNMENT FOR THE 1999-2000 FISCAL YEAR THAT WOULD OTHERWISE REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE TRANSFERRED BY THE STATE TREASURER TO THE STATE PUBLIC SCHOOL FUND CREATED IN SECTION 22-54-114, C.R.S.; EXCEPT THAT THE AMOUNT TRANSFERRED SHALL NOT EXCEED TWO MILLION DOLLARS. THIS SUBSECTION (3) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1, 2000.".

Amendment No. 5, by Senator Anderson

Amend reengrossed bill, page 2, line 15, strike "1998-99";

strike lines 16 through 20 and substitute the following:

" PRIOR BUDGET YEAR OR THE SIZE FACTOR USED IN THE CALCULATION FOR THE APPLICABLE BUDGET YEAR, WHICHEVER IS LESS, AND THE AT-RISK FACTOR CALCULATED FOR THE DISTRICT USING A BASE AT-RISK FACTOR OF ELEVEN AND ONE-HALF PERCENT.".

Amendment No. 6, by Senator Anderson

Amend reengrossed bill, page 6, after line 26, insert the following:

"SECTION 6. 22-54-104 (5) (f), Colorado Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

22-54-104. District total program - repeal. (5) For purposes of the formulas used in this section:

(f) (I) If the district percentage of at-risk pupils is greater than the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils and the district's funded pupil count is greater than four hundred fifty-nine BUT NOT IN EXCESS OF FIFTY THOUSAND, the district's at-risk factor shall be 11.5% plus a 0.30 percentage point for each percentage point that the district percentage of at-risk pupils exceeds the statewide average percentage of at-risk pupils; except that no district's at-risk factor shall exceed 30%.

(II) IF THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS IS GREATER THAN THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS AND THE DISTRICT'S FUNDED PUPIL COUNT IS GREATER THAN FIFTY THOUSAND, THE DISTRICT'S AT-RISK FACTOR SHALL BE 11.5% PLUS A 0.34 PERCENTAGE POINT FOR EACH PERCENTAGE POINT THAT THE DISTRICT PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS EXCEEDS THE STATEWIDE AVERAGE PERCENTAGE OF AT-RISK PUPILS; EXCEPT THAT NO DISTRICT'S AT-RISK FACTOR SHALL EXCEED 30%.".

AMENDMENT TO THE REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE

HB 00-1159 by Rep. Allen; Senator Anderson--School Finance

Senator Linkhart moved to amend the Report of the Committee of the Whole to show that the following Linkhart floor amendment to HB00-1159, as amended, did pass:

Amend reengrossed bill, page 10, after line 7, insert the following:

"(2) In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the general fund not otherwise appropriated, to the department of education, public school finance, for the state share of districts' total program funding, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, the sum of eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary.".

Renumber succeeding subsections accordingly.

Page 11, after line 4, insert the following:

"SECTION 10. Appropriation - adjustments to the 1999 long bill. (1) For implementation of this act, appropriations made in Part VII of section 2 of chapter 364, Session Laws of Colorado 1999, shall be adjusted as follows:

(a) The appropriation to the department of human services, division of self-sufficiency, for the short-term works emergency fund, shall be reduced by eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000). Said sum shall be from federal temporary assistance for needy families block grant funds.

(b) The appropriation to the department of human services, division of children, youth and families, for child welfare services, shall be amended as follows:

(I) The appropriation from the general fund shall be reduced by eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000).

(II) The appropriation from federal funds shall be increased by eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000). Said sum shall be from federal temporary assistance for needy families block grant funds that have been transferred to programs funded by Title XX of the federal Social Security Act, as authorized under federal law.".

In addition to any other appropriation, there is hereby appropriated, out of any moneys in the drug offender surcharge fund, created in section 18-19-103, Colorado Revised Statutes, not otherwise appropriated, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2000, the sum of six hundred sixty-eight thousand six hundred fourteen dollars (\$668,614) and 6.9 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the implementation of this act. Of such sum, five hundred ninety-four thousand seven hundred one dollars (\$594,701) and 5.3 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the judicial department, and seventy-three thousand nine hundred fourteen dollars (\$73,913) and 1.6 FTE, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the public defender.".
