IF SUCH MEMBER OR MEMBERS PROVIDE SUCH WRITTEN NOTICE, THE ADDITION OR CHANGE TO THE SIP OR ANY ELEMENT THEREOF THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF ANY SUCH BILL MAY NOT BE SUBMITTED TO THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE FEDERAL ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY UNTIL THE EXPIRATION OF THE ADDITION OR CHANGE TO THE SIP HAS BEEN POSTPONED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ACTING BY BILL OR THE MEMBER OR MEMBERS PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL THAT NO BILL WILL BE INTRODUCED.".

Page 4, line 1, after "SECTION," insert "OR A NOTICE IS PROVIDED BY A MEMBER OR MEMBERS THAT THEY ARE INTRODUCING A BILL UNDER PARAGRAPH (c) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2) WITHIN THREE DAYS AFTER LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACTION NOT TO INTRODUCE A BILL UNDER PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2),".

Page 5, line 6, after the period, add "ANY BILL INTRODUCED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (c) SHALL NOT BE COUNTED AGAINST THE NUMBER OF BILLS TO WHICH MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ARE LIMITED BY LAW OR JOINT RULE OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES. ANY COMMITTEE OF REFERENCE OF THE SENATE OR THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES TO WHICH A BILL INTRODUCED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH (c) IS REFERRED SHALL CONDUCT AS PART OF CONSIDERATION OF ANY SUCH BILL ON THE MERITS THE REVIEW PROVIDED FOR UNDER PARAGRAPH (a) OF THIS SUBSECTION (2).";

- (II) Twenty percent of the unused moneys shall be deposited in the search and rescue fund created in section 33-1-112.5 (1); and
- (III) TEN PERCENT OF THE UNUSED MONEYS SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE ACCESS TO WILDLIFE SPORTING GRANT FUND CREATED IN SECTION $33-1-112\ (9)$."
