Education After consideration on the merits, the committee recommends that <u>SB00-031</u> be amended as follows and, as so amended, be referred to the Committee on Appropriations with favorable recommendation:

Amend printed bill, page 3, line 7, strike "TWO" and substitute "SIX";

line 9, strike "ONE SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT MEETS" and substitute "TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT MEET";

line 10, strike "22-85-103 (2) (a) AND ONLY ONE SCHOOL" and substitute "22-85-103 (2) (a), ONLY TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT MEET";

line 11, strike "DISTRICT THAT MEETS";

line 12, strike "(b)." and substitute "(b), AND ONLY TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT MEET THE CRITERIA SPECIFIED IN SECTION 22-85-103 (2) (c).";

line 22, strike "(a) OR (b)" and substitute "(a), (b), OR (c)".

Page 4, line 13, after "SHALL" insert "REQUIRE THAT EACH APPLICANT OUTLINE ITS ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT GOALS AND SHALL";

strike lines 15 through 26 and substitute the following:

"(a) TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS SELECTED FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE LARGE SCHOOL DISTRICTS AS CATEGORIZED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

(b) TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS SELECTED FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE MEDIUM SCHOOL DISTRICTS AS CATEGORIZED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.

(c) TWO SCHOOL DISTRICTS SELECTED FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE SMALL SCHOOL DISTRICTS AS CATEGORIZED BY THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION.".

Page 5, strike lines 1 and 2.

Page 7, line 2, strike "PROGRAM;" and substitute "PROGRAM AND THE CORRELATION OF THOSE PERFORMANCE LEVELS TO THE ANNUAL ACHIEVEMENT GOALS;";

INTRODUCTION OF CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

The following concurrent resolution was read by title and referred to the committees indicated:

SCR 00-003 by Senator Evans; also Representative Witwer--Concerning the submission to the registered electors of the state of Colorado of an amendment to article X of the constitution of the state of Colorado, establishing a homestead exemption for a specified percentage of a limited amount of the actual value of owner-occupied residential real property that is the primary residence of an owner-occupier who is sixty-five years of age or older and has resided in such property for five years or longer, and, in connection therewith, allowing the general assembly by law to adjust the maximum amount of actual value of such residential real property of which such specified percentage shall be exempt, requiring the aggregate statewide valuation for assessment that is attributable to residential real property to be calculated as if the full actual value of all owner-occupied primary residences that are partially exempt from taxation was subject to taxation for assessment for residential real property, requiring the general assembly to compensate local governmental entities for the net amount of property tax revenues lost as a result of the homestead exemption, and specifying that said compensation shall constitute a voter-approved revenue change and shall not be included in state or local government fiscal year spending or subject to any statutory limitation on general fund appropriations.
