To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives:

Your first conference committee appointed on SB00-171, concerning certain abandoned children, has met and reports that it has agreed upon the following:

1. That the Senate accede to the House amendments made to the bill, as said amendments appear in the rerevised bill, with the following changes:

Amend rerevised bill, page 2, line 11, strike "FIREFIGHTER AT A FIRE STATION," and substitute "FIREFIGHTER,";

line 12, strike "AT A HOSPITAL";

line 13, strike "PATIENTS" and substitute "PATIENTS, WHEN SUCH FIREFIGHTER IS AT A FIRE STATION OR SUCH HOSPITAL STAFF MEMBER IS AT A HOSPITAL.";

line 19, strike "FIREFIGHTER AT A FIRE STATION," and substitute "FIREFIGHTER,";

line 21, after "PATIENTS,", insert "WHEN SUCH FIREFIGHTER IS AT A FIRE STATION OR SUCH HOSPITAL STAFF MEMBER IS AT A HOSPITAL,";

line 22, strike "AT A HOSPITAL".

2. That, under the authority granted the committee to consider matters not at issue between the two houses, the following amendment be recommended:

Amend rerevised bill, page 4, before line 1, insert the following:

"(7) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HEREBY FINDS, DETERMINES, AND DECLARES THAT A COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES SHALL PLACE AN ABANDONED CHILD WITH A POTENTIAL ADOPTIVE PARENT AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER DECLARES THAT, AS SOON AS LAWFULLY POSSIBLE, A COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES SHALL PROCEED WITH A MOTION TO TERMINATE THE PARENTAL RIGHTS OF A PARENT WHO ABANDONS A CHILD.".
