"maintains standards as set by the institution for its students generally, A CUMULATIVE GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF 2.5 OR ABOVE BASED UPON A 4.0 SCALE, but said benefits shall not be extended beyond twelve academic quarters or eight academic semesters as the case may be THE ACADEMIC YEAR IN WHICH THE DEPENDENT TURNS TWENTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE. Such dependents pursuing";

line 20, after "tuition", insert "AND ROOM AND BOARD".
