This letter sets forth my reasons for vetoing the bill. As you know, HB 01-1209 allows for the free tasting of alcoholic 24 beverages at retail liquor stores or liquor-licensed drugstores. Both as a state legislator and now as Governor, I have worked hard to reduce the 25 incidence of driving while intoxicated and strengthen our road safety 27 laws. However, in 1999, 30% of all traffic fatalities in Colorado involved 28 a blood alcohol content of .05% or higher. While I appreciate the efforts of the sponsors to address concerns about this bill, I nevertheless believe that it establishes a poor precedent by weakening, rather than 31 strengthening, the safety of our roads. 32 Furthermore, HB 01-1209 places the burden on local governments to opt-33 34 out of tastings in their community. It is my belief that the proponents of this program should "opt-in" by convincing local authorities that tastings 35 make sense for their communities.
