1 state general fund revenues and allowable state general fund appropriations for the 2001-02 budget year. 3 Committee on Finance 4 5 WHEREAS, The general assembly is required by section 6 24-75-201.3, Colorado Revised Statutes, to make an annual certification 7 of its estimate of general fund revenues for the next fiscal year to the 8 controller; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Gross general fund revenues for the 2001-02 fiscal year, as estimated in this joint resolution, have already been obligated by 12 law as follows: 13 14 (1) \$103,737,591 for transfer to the capital construction fund 15 pursuant to section 24-75-302 (2) (n), Colorado Revised Statutes; 16 17 (2) Amounts required by statute to be used for: Payments to local 18 governments based on state cigarette tax collections; property tax and 19 heat or fuel expense grants; and payments to the fire and police members' 20 benefit fund; and 21 WHEREAS, Under current law, general fund revenues must be used first to fund the obligations set forth above, second to fund 24 appropriations for the executive, legislative, and judicial departments, and 25 third to fund the reserve mandated by section 24-75-201.1 (1) (d), Colorado Revised Statutes; and 27 28 WHEREAS, The general assembly recognizes that new programs can be funded from the general fund only after these three priorities are satisfied; and 31 32 WHEREAS, If appropriate statutes are amended, additional 33 general fund revenues could be realized; and 34 35 WHEREAS, The estimate of general fund revenues certified in this resolution does not include the balance carried forward from the 2000-01 37 fiscal year; and 38 39 WHEREAS, The general assembly intends to make an annual certification of its estimate of the total allowable state general fund 41 appropriations under section 24-75-201.1, Colorado Revised Statutes; and 42 43 WHEREAS, In accordance with the provisions of section 44 24-75-201.1, Colorado Revised Statutes, the estimate of the allowable 45 state general fund appropriations for the 2001-02 fiscal year will be based 46 upon the following conclusions: 47 48 (1) State general fund appropriations for the 2000-01 fiscal year, 49 prior to the enactment of any supplemental appropriations during the 50 2001 regular session, are \$5,317.4 million; 51 (2) The allowable increase in state general fund appropriations for 53 the 2001-02 fiscal year is the cost of reappraisal of taxable property for property tax purposes as required by section 39-1-105.5, Colorado 54 Revised Statutes, plus 6% of the 2000-01 state general fund 55

appropriations; and

 WHEREAS, The revenue estimate and the estimate of allowable state general fund appropriations made pursuant to this resolution are made for the purpose of providing direction and guidance to the joint budget committee in the preparation of the 2001-02 general appropriation act and does not affect the ability of the general assembly to make spending decisions in the general appropriation act; and

WHEREAS, The revenue estimate and the estimate of allowable state general fund appropriations made pursuant to this resolution may be adjusted if additional relevant information is received by the general assembly after the adoption thereof; and

WHEREAS, For purposes of section 39 of article V of the state constitution, this joint resolution relates solely to the transaction of business of the two houses of the general assembly; now, therefore,

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the Sixty-third General Assembly of the State of Colorado, the Senate concurring herein:

That, in accordance with section 24-75-201.3, Colorado Revised Statutes, the general assembly hereby certifies to the controller of the state of Colorado that the estimate of gross general fund revenues for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, is \$6,752.6 million. The general assembly further certifies that the estimate of the allowable state general fund appropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, under section 24-75-201.1, Colorado Revised Statutes, is \$5,636.4 million.

Be It Further Resolved, That a copy of this Joint Resolution be transmitted to the controller of the state of Colorado, Arthur L. Barnhart.
